# Chambers, White show

STURT'S inspired forwards key Stephen White and Brant Chambers almost single handedly crushed a workman-like Glenelg to give the Blues a wearisome 32-point win — but little else — at Adelaide Oval yesterday.

Together White (2.3) and Chambers (6.4) took 18 strong marks and kicked eight of the Blues 17 goals to be probably the only highlights of a lack-lustre contest which frustrated onlookers.

They were the important difference between the two combatants and the principal reason Sturt never was truly threatened.

Sturt could afford to kick long and direct and be certain the big men would give a strong contest.

Glenelg, which did not have that luxury, had to attempt to infiltrate the attacking 50 metres almost by stealth,

White and Chambers could have killed off the contest in the first term but for inaccuracy. Glenelg, which lost creative centreman Steven Salopek to the Power before the game, deliberately and unashamedly set out to block Sturt's trademark run and it worked.

Apart from 10-minute burst late in the second term when Sturt added 5.0 to the Tigers solitary goal which virtually decided the final margin — the Blues showed little of its slick teamwork and clean skills.

Sturt, which went in without Ben Nelson (hamstring), became unbalanced in the

middle with Tim Weatherald (hip) and Marty Mattner (back) off by the first minute of the second quarter.

It was not a win for football purists.

"They (Glenelg) just played a negative style of game and we didn't cope particularly well. In the first quarter we were particularly good at it but then we just didn't cope with it," coach Brenton Phillips said.

"We just didn't have enough running through our half-forward line (but) the most pleasing part was that we could have turned it up quite easily but we toughed it out."

The day became even bleaker for Glenelg's reliable Paul Sherwood who fractured his left ankle while successfully spoiling Chambers during the second quarter. Positively, Glenelg kicked a goal first in every quarter and Billy Neely, Heath Culpitt, Ben Moore and Brett Higgins niggled and annoyed their more heralded opponents through the day.

Yet, Sturt always was able to cause critical turnovers, and make them hurt, because Glenelg kept missing targets.

"We didn't seem to release it (ball) quick enough to break (the play) open," Tigers coach David Noble said.

"They (Sturt) knew we'd try to shut-it down to a point (but) the quality in our ball use is not as good as the topenders. Given another pre-season I think we won't be far away."
