

OODVILLE-West Torrens called on all the emotion it could muster to hold off Glenelg by 19 points on one of the club's most significant occasions at Woodville Oval yesterday.

Playing in honour of 1993 premiership heroes Jamie Tape and Laurence Schache, the Eagles were determined to give their former team-mates the best possible tribute after a minute's silence before the bounce. This was particularly evident in the second term when, after an even first quarter, the home side broke free by keeping the visitors scoreless and adding 6.4 to give them a comfortable 45-point buffer at the main break.

With all Glenelg's attention on containing the Eagles' midfield guns it allowed unheralded Josh Mc-Loughlan and James McLure enough freedom to feed forwards Trent Hentschel and Mark Passador, who finished with 3.2 each.

As they trudged off at half-time with at least 14 senior players out injured – including late withdrawals Heath Culpitt and Trevor Cranston – the Tigers appeared headed for the scrapheap. In previous seasons, the Bays might have capitulated but in a spirited display they fought back in the premiership quarter to bring themselves within striking distance of the Eagles at three-quarter time.

Sudjai Cook booted three classy goals and set up at least one more for the third term, while Brett Backwell used his 12 possesions in a positive manner.

when Billy Neely - who cut Gavin Colville out of the game - and Matthew Manfield, making the most of a free kick downfield, slotted consecutive goals, the visitors began to believe they were a chance.

But thanks to the resolute efforts of key Eagles defenders Steven Hall and Brent Frewen, the home side steadied with majors to Passador and Nathan Bock, giving them their second win for the season and a memorable farewell for two of the club's best.

"We played some good footy early," Eagles coach Ron Fuller said.

"But I think we became reactive after that and didn't do the instinctive things we had done earlier, so that's something we have to keep working on." Fuller paid tribute to the opposition after his team was outscored by 26 points in a poor second half. "I think that's a slur on the opposition if you say you relax," Fuller said.

Buoyed by his team's new-found resilience, Glenelg coach David Noble believes their challenge now is to put it together for a full 100 minutes.

"If we can take that and produce it as a more consistent part of our game we're going to be around the mark to knock over a few (teams) as we're going," Noble said.

Glenelg outfits in the past may have thrown in the towel at half-time but Noble's arrival appears to have had an effect. "That's not their nature (to give in)," Noble said. "We've worked really hard to address that and there would have been quite a few in the grandstand who would have been thinking they're not going to get to six or eight goals let alone put ourselves in a situation where we could win."
