

11-goal term sinks Tigers

A SECOND-quarter harvest of 11 goals powered West Adelaide to a 49-point triumph over Glenelg at Glenelg Oval yesterday.

The Bloods' 21.10 (136) to 13.9 (87) victory came after that term which blew away the match and ensured they would post their ninth straight victory over the the Tigers.

The match was all but over at half time after West produced a clinical display, which saw it kick 11 goals to two for the quarter.

The Bloods dominated all aspects of the game during that quarter, slamming on five goals in succession — all in the space of 10 minutes — before Glenelg could even respond, with a rollover looking like it was on the cards. The game started with a flourish as both teams went hard at the ball in a first quarter which was evenly matched, producing 10 goals.

It was a game that was dominated by accurate goalkicking — especially from West — with

Bloods forward Darren Bradshaw leading the way and eventually finishing the game with 7.1. West's accurate kicking was a stark contrast from its game against North where its finishing inside 50m was disappointing.

The Bloods had winners all over the ground in the second quarter with Salim Hassan brilliant across half-forward and Sam Fisher and Dominic Cassisi booting three goals each in the second quarter.

In contrast, Glenelg only had Ben Moore and Sudjai Cook casting any influence on the game, as the Bays could only muster 58 possessions to 100 in the second quarter.

However, to Glenelg's credit, it managed to claw its way back, with Glenelg coach David Noble's words at the long change ringing in the players'

ears. After the main break, the Tigers outscored the Bloods four goals to two — and it could have been more had it not been for the Bloods' hard defence.

West's skill level and goal kicking was just too good.

Coach Shaun Rehn said his team's efforts and persistence in the second quarter set up the win.

"There were just a couple of things that we allowed Glenelg to do in that first quarter, which played into their hands and once our players corrected that, it was more one-on-one contest," Rehn said.

Noble said the second quarter was disappointing.

"Our other three quarters were right on the money and everything was in place (to win) but you can't win games when you let sides kick 11 goals in a quarter," he said.
