Pumped-up Tigers give South a wake-up call

GUTSY Glenelg gave South Adelaide an embarrassing awakening and a 41-point flogging at Brighton Rd yesterday — a loss that should send shivers through the Panthers camp.

The margin didn't highlight the amount of control the raw, but willing, Tigers had over the game, especially after half-time.

Glenelg players were almost always first to the ball, harder running off the ball and more disciplined and robust than South, which is privately dreaming of playing finals while Glenelg admits to be rebuilding.

The Tigers confidently seized control of the outcome with nine unanswered goals—from when Matt Manfield goaled on the half-time siren from outside 50m until livewire Sudjai Cook slammed his fifth goal through minutes before the three-quarter time siren.

Glenelg again went in without lead ruckman Brad Smith (hamstring) but dominated the centre clearances and ran free down the corridor.

South's big-hearted Mark Bradley won his share of taps (21) but it was in-and-under Glenelg players who worked the ball out of centre and easily found targets because of South's failure to apply pressure.

Glenelg repeatedly outnumbered South at the ball because its players were united and had more hardheaded commitment.

"The boys were a little stirred by the loss (death) of (stalwart) Billy Neill and they needed to pay some due respect and they did that," Tiger coach David Noble said.

"We concentrated more on the way we wanted to play.

"That's the style of player we've got and that sort of tackling effort and intensity is what's going to win us games."

Cagey Noble restuctured his attack going into a strong wind in the second term and follower Brett Backwell exploded with 12 damaging touches in the quarter.

Kym Koster, against his old club, unsung Craig Robinson, Nathan Bell, Craig Statham, Ben Mules and Billy Neely cleaned up everything.
