Salopek future Power skipper, says Bays boss

LENELG coach David Noble has touted boom Power recruit Steven Salopek as a potential captain of Port Adelaide's AFL club.

Noble, the Tigers' first-year coach and former Western Bulldogs assistant coach, has guided Salopek through just two senior SANFL matches but already has seen enough to know the 17-year-old is a player of rare skill and character. "He's just a quality young

man," Noble said.

"I've been involved with a fair bit of the junior stuff, a lot of the guys who came through with the Bulldogs and he's as genuine an intent a person as I've seen. I would think that if Port can hang on to him, he's a future captain. I've got no doubt."

Salopek's 29-possession, three-goal game was a highlight of another game for Glenelg that contained enough positives to give hope for the club's immediate future but again ended without two premiership points.

The discipline of Billy Neely, who contained the usually prolific Brett James to 10 possessions, was another positive for the Tigers, Noble suggesting Neely's form warranted him being considered for state duties.

Glenelg's structure - with Brad Smith and Matthew Manfield providing targets up forward and alternating with Michael Griffiths in ruck and Leigh Brockman marshaling the defence - was good enough to trouble Norwood for long periods of the game. When Norwood found another gear, however, at the start of the final quarter, the Tigers seemed to retreat within themselves, reacting to what their opponents were doing rather than setting the tone of the match. The Legs piled on four unanswered goals in the first 13 minutes of the term to secure a comefrom-behind victory.

"That's the frustration of today that you let a side nearly double its score against you in the last quarter. It's just inexcusable," Noble said. "We can't have the situation where you're taking two steps forward, then getting belted and taking three steps backwards.

"You've got to keep the pressure on yourself to keep maintaining that. There's no doubt you take some positives out of it but the last quarter undoes all your good work."

Norwood takes a raft of positives out of a match that was about character and de-

termination as much as skill. Coming off successive losses and down by 22 points in the third quarter, Norwood was "under the pump" according to coach Garry McIntosh.

That it found something extra is a trait that will stand the club in good stead for the rest of the season.

"The beauty is we've got a lot of young players in the side – we probably had seven blokes who had played under 15 games today - and to come away from that game with a win will give them a great sense of belief," McIntosh said. He singled out viceTigers midfielder Brent Backwell after half-time, saying it was critical to Norwood's resurgence.

"And (Scott) Direen started to get a lot of ball at the back, our on-ballers started to get their hands on the ball and we started to get some fluency," McIntosh said of the change in Norwood's game.

Without Robbie Neill, however, Norwood would not have been in a position to make a charge. He booted three first-term goals, had an impact in the midfield when he was swung there in the second quarter and finished captain Troy Clements for the game with 23 touches, the restricting job he did on nine marks and five goals.
