CHANGE is as good as a holiday - just ask the Bays.

After concern from players about excessive time spent at the club, following the second bye, Glenelg coach David Noble changed their training from Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays to Mondays, Tuesdays and Thursdays, allowing players to rock up for the weekend's games fresh to play.

After setting a target of winning eight to 10 games this year – enough to make them a smokey for the finals – the Bays were well short, notching three from their first 12 games before their second bye. Initially it looked like a disastrous decision, losing by three goals to West before the disgraceful 104-point hammering at the hands of lowly Norwood in round 16, when Glenelg scored a solitary goal.

Then, suddenly, the Bays clicked.

A six-point loss to highly-ranked Sturt was followed by a stunning win over premiership favourites the Eagles, who had won 12 straight in the first half of the season.

They were comfortably beaten by Central the next week - but so were most teams and wins against South, North then Norwood on Saturday saw the Bays win a hat-trick of games for the first time since 1999.

The structural change in training saw a focus on simple skills but maintaining them over longer periods of time – resulting in sustained intensity in matches.

Noble said the changes were made in part to benefit the senior players.

"Some of the players were concerned about the longevity they spend at the club," Noble said. "If you train on Friday, you probably feel like you never have a break - you play Saturday, rehab Sunday, back to the club on Monday. Now they have Friday off, they can have some time away from the place and they just feel like they're fresh when they get to the game on Saturday, so it's all good."

And all signs are pointing at a continued push up the ladder in 2005, with Heath Culpitt, who racked up 32 disposals against Norwood, signed to play for the Bays next year. Saturday's best-on-ground Billy Neely, who had a staggering 18 kicks and 28 handballs, Trevor Cranston and Brett Backwell are all in discussions with Glenelg to continue.

"They're important to us because they've worked through the hard times as much as I have," Noble said. "We've scrapped and fought to get to where we are now and once we get a couple of key forwards in we've got a pretty good future at the club. Our backline played the best it has for the year."

Noble, a former assistant coach at the Western Bulldogs, has told the Crows of his big raps on elevated rookie Aidan Parker, who was superb at centre half-back on Saturday.

"I certainly think there's a place for him on an AFL list," Noble said. "They could play him off half-back or in a back pocket, or with the right match-up he could pinch-hit at centre half-back from time to time.

"I think he's got a clever brain and can assess the time to step off and when to stay on his man."
