Bays mean business when it really counts

NO PAIN, no gain is new Glenelg coach Peter Simmons' secret for overcoming the second-half blues this season. Restructuring his team's training around two solid hours with a long break in the middle has taught the Bays to sustain concentration beyond the second half - which they struggled to do last year.

It was also evident for the first two trial games before they finally got it together and stunned Central District in the final trial.

"If you look at last year's effort, a lot of the games the Glenelg Football Club lost were in the third quarter, so we have been very conscious of putting in a good showing in the third quarter," Simmons said. "Last week against Central we worked really hard to get some structure and organisation in our third quarter and then follow that through (against West)."

"It was really evident in our first two trial games there were some huge 10-minute or so lapses in concentration where we were just terrible."

"Part of our program is that we go hard for a couple of hours and we've structured a reasonable-sized break in the middle of our training sessions - which our players haven't enjoyed - but it's been all about being organised when it's time to go and do the business. The spirit of the guys is such that whether we're up or down, they just know (the third quarter) is such an important period of time."

"When you're four goals down

against a club which you haven't beaten in the past 12 encounters, that takes a lot of courage."

Inside knowledge helped Simmons plot West Adelaide's downfall at Broadspectrum Oval on Saturday.

Simmons coached West's under-17s for the previous four years. In that time he gained a special understanding of West coach Shaun Rehn's methodologies and structures which ensured when the Bloods shot out to a four-goal lead, all was not lost.

Tigers draw blood

PETER Simmons announced his arrival as new Glenelg coach in the best possible way when his Tigers staged a remarkable comeback to upset West Adelaide at Broadspectrum Oval yesterday.

In a fiery season opener, two players were helped off the field as the Bays fought fire with fire in Simmons' first official game as Tigers' coach - one that could keep the video reviewers busy.

Glenelg was behind the eightball for most of the game but never gave up.

When Sudjai Cook posted his second goal 18 minutes into the last term to give the Bays the lead for the first time, it was the beginning of the end.

Daniel Kirk's follow-up goal was all it took to nail West's coffin shut. The Bloods seemed uninterested and undisciplined in the last quarter with Glenelg finally winning 15.12 (102) to 14.7 (91).

Despite being savaged by the draft for another year, the Bloods went on the front foot early in a decisively different attitude to last season.

But the early flair gave way to scrappiness as the game wore on and, as coach Shaun Rehn said: "we allowed it to become an arm-wrestle".

"We were well on top and we gave away three or four goals from very costly turnovers based on decision-making and skill which allowed them back in the game," Rehn said.

"Ultimately we felt that as the game went on we needed to get in front in regards to having the legs to get home, and basically for a half it was just an arm-wrestle."

It was always a danger game for West after Glenelg stunned Central District in last week's trial match.

Yesterday started at a frantic pace with plenty of feeling. Bloods captain Luke Norman hit Brett Backwell with a solid hip-and-shoulder across Glenelg's half-forward line in the second quarter that saw the Glenelg

midfielder spin 360 degrees in the air before landing on the ground motionless.

Showing there is no love lost between the clubs, Norman was cheered off like a hero when he was rested later in the second quarter - showing passion is as strong as ever at SANFL level.

Backwell eventually got to his feet and trotted off the ground, returning soon after.

Bloods' forward Nicholas Prokopec gave Schuback a suspiciously high hip-and-shoulder that forced him from the ground in the third quarter, just when the Bays were gaining momentum.

West's Central District re-

cruit Prokopec, who couldn't get a regular game with the Bulldogs last year, showed sublime composure under pressure at full-forward and Patrick Wiggins led and marked strongly.

It took Glenelg 17 minutes to post its first goal, thanks to the tireless Cook, but the Bays were well and truly back in it when Paul Allison ran forward to manufacture a goal out of nothing and Backwell followed it up.

Adding insult to injury, Bloods' 18-year-old debutant half-forward Scott Lewis, their best player, injured his ankle in the last quarter and could miss up to two weeks.
