Simmons laments Bays' costly lapse

GLENELG suffered a costly loss to Woodville-West Torrens on Saturday and Tigers coach Peter Simmons knows it.

Up 33 points early in the third term, the Tigers had a golden opportunity to cruise into the top five on the back of wins over highly-rated Central District and the Eagles.

Instead, Glenelg is in sixth place and Simmons is left wondering why the Tigers displayed such an appalling lack of discipline in the second half.

The Tigers burst through lines in the first half but they couldn't even run to the right spots when the Eagles surged. And pointless backchat to the umpires cost Glenelg dearly and

revived memories of its horror past, Simmons said.

"Perhaps over-confidence, having an opportunity with the top side under the hammer, being six goals up means you can lairise a little bit and start to pick and chose what to do with the ball," the first-year coach said. "That comes back to being undisciplined."

"As an observer of the footy club over the past few years, I think one of the most obvious things to most observers is that the club has been undisciplined on the field, at times."

Simmons said the players echoed his thoughts about "bad habits" after the match but they paid a high price to learn a fundamental lesson. Glenelg was poised to win four success-

ive games in the same year for the first time in six seasons.

"Now we start again," Simmons said.

Eagles coach Ron Fuller was equally puzzled at how his outfit could miss so many opportunities early then click into devastating action.

Adelaide's Trent Hentschel helped spark the revival and did enough at both ends of the ground to make Crows selectors happy.

"We tried to do low-percentage stuff," he said. "Our concentration was terrible, better then good ... you give up sometimes, you just don't know what goes through their heads. The lesson is - play to your limitations, perhaps." The Eagles have the bye this week.

Eagles rock Bays

Terrible, says coach

CHARGING Woodville-West Torrens pulled back a 33-point deficit then trampled Glenelg into the spacious Woodville Oval with a character-filled 20-point win yesterday to underline its top-of-the-table status.

If the Eagles ever managed to put together four quarters of their best, precise football they would be devastating.

Yet, even at half tilt - make no mistake, Glenelg controlled the first half - the Eagles proved it takes more than skills and a bit of confidence to be a major player in SANFL ranks.

Down 33 points almost 10 minutes into the third term, the Eagles set about systematically dismantling the Tigers' formation from the inside with some trademark hard-tacking teamwork.

The Eagles kicked 8.6 to nothing from 12 minutes into the third quarter until Glenelg's Heath Culpitt broke the flow 17 minutes into the fourth quarter.

To rub in the insult, at least four of the Eagles' six points in that game-breaking burst should have been goals. They missed 10 routine shots at goal from inside 45 metres for the day, which only served to highlight their domination of play after half-time against an outfit that started with flair and purpose.

Creative Tim Inkster, Mark McKenzie and Adelaide mop-haired key utility Trent Hentschel, were among the handful of Eagles hard at it and reliable from the outset, finally finding some running support from the on-ballers in the second half.

Matthew Stokes, wasteful in the first half, Peter Fiacchi, Justin Cicolella, Luke Powell and Chris Knights flew into action and the Eagles went from dismal to devastating in the space of 25 minutes.

Mark Passador went to his sweet spot at the goalfont early in the third quarter and sparked the revival which reduced the formerly constructive and cohesive Tigers to an undisciplined mess.

Several times, when a soft free was paid against the Tigers, pointless backchat cost them 50-metre penalties

- Michael Avon paid two against David Mitchell - which turned into goals at the opposite end.

More cutting was the consequent decline in on-field concentration - from all but Adam Fisher, Culpitt and tireless Paul Sherwood - and respect for fundamental defensive skills that had Glenelg setting the standard in the first half.

Eagles coach Ron Fuller said he simply put a challenge to his charges at half-time and they responded.

"When we were decisive, it worked for us and for some reason their whole game came together," Fuller said.

"They became more accountable, used the ball better and they ran better. It's about being a bit more assertive from the start."

Seven days after rolling

Central District with its best performance in years, Glenelg coach Peter Simmons was left wondering why bad habits reappear. Glenelg kicked the first three goals of the third term when it was flying but then everything turned to rubbish.

"It was terrible, wasn't it?" he said of the discipline.

"Whether some of those things that went against us were there or not, we actually gave the umpires opportunities to make decisions against us. Once we did one
