# We threw in the towel, fumes Rehn

FIERY coach Shaun Rehn finally snapped yesterday, accusing West Adelaide of "throwing in the towel" in its embarrassing 54-point drubbing by Glenelg at the Bay.

The imposing Rehn did not mince words with his outfit in a stinging after-match dressing down which cast the rooms in an eerie silence.

He warned many Bloods were facing uncertain futures unless they honestly assessed their efforts then find the grunt that's gone missing in a season that has brought just one win from 10 games.

West capitulated deplorably in the final quarter yesterday. Kicking with a six to seven-goal wind it won a meagre 57 disposals to Glenelg's 103 and added 0.4 to the Tigers' 4.3 in an astonishing collapse. West was 31 points down at the final break which was within reach if it gave an honest effort - that's what pushed Rehn past his breaking point.

"Yeah, they threw the towel in," he said. "From my perception it was, I was embarrassed by what they did in the last quarter. This mob... is not the same mob they were two years ago and they're not the same mob they were half-way through last year when they were still trying to fight it out against adversity."

"It's (about) not having the inclination to finish your work. They keep letting each other down. It's certainly the crossroads for a lot of blokes."

By its own statistics, West went into its attacking 50-metre arc 63 times for the day, 10 times more than Glenelg, but it scraped together only eight goals and, tellingly, none in the wind-assisted last quarter.

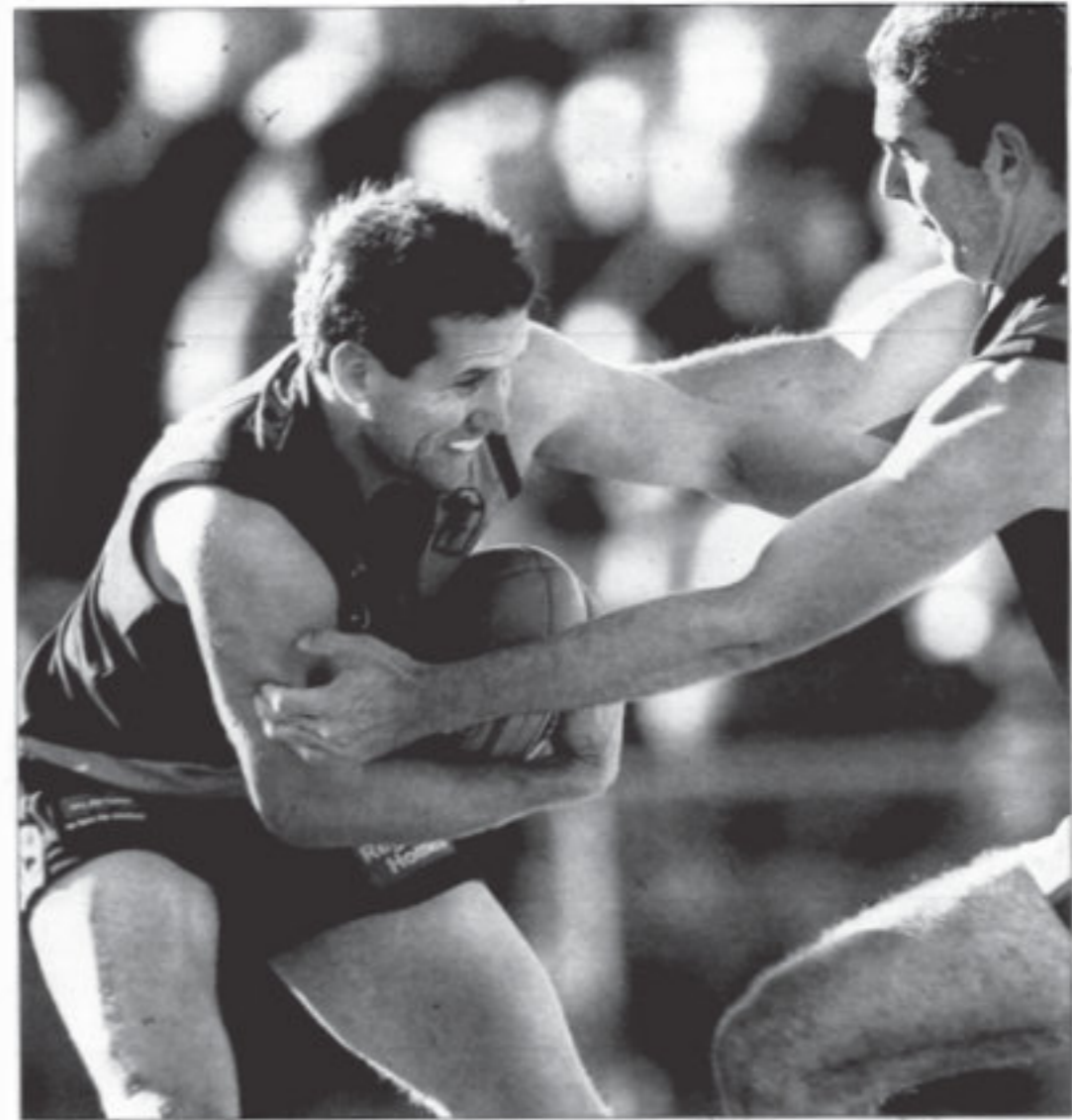
Even with a rash of skill errors, missed targets and poor decisions, the Bloods scrapped to within five points at half-time. West could have been closer at the last break but for regrettable misses by Luke Norman, playing on after a mark 20m out, then Matthew Illman, who missed a routine shot from 40m from a mark, both in time-on of the third term.

But nothing could prepare Rehn for West's collapse after the Tigers engineered more space at half-forward and began running hard down the corridor.

"I thought our backline was fantastic early but pure weight of numbers got them," Rehn said.

That came largely because Tigers generators Heath Culpitt, Billy Neely, Brett Backwell, cool-headed wingman Matthew Reavill and rebounding defenders Troy Butcher and Ben Mules relentlessly ran hard through the middle.

They feasted off tireless ruckman Trevor Cranston and spearheads Matthew Duldig, moved to half-
