Pocket dynamo

Clayton inspires Magpies

HE was the smallest player on the ground but Port Adelaide's Jeremy Clayton had by far the biggest impact at Alberton Oval yesterday.


The 175cm, 76kg dynamo was the Magpies' chief engineer as he amassed a staggering 26 possessions in the first half to inspire his team to retain its top-five berth with a comfortable 37-point victory against Glenelg.

Coupled with the support of teammate Daniel Elstone (21 first-half disposals), Clayton did as he pleased as he revelled in the slippery conditions at ground level, refusing to waste any of his valuable touches.

"He's a great player, he's very courageous and he helped set the game up in the first half," Port Adelaide coach John Cahill said of Clayton who finished with 34 disposals and five tackles.

And when the duo finally slowed down somewhat in the second half, the human timebomb Clive Waterhouse - exploded with five goals after the main change, thanks mainly to his nemesis Paul Sherwood leaving the arena with a hamstring injury.

Nevertheless, Waterhouse thrilled the Magpie faithful with his unrivalled unpredictability, regularly playing

"He just couldn't take it cleanly in the first half but in the second half he was good," Cahill said of Waterhouse.

"He was the difference in the finish because he put the game away by kicking some goals."

Despite being quiet in the first half, Waterhouse's ability to handle the conditions was symbolic of how well the Magpies dealt with the first serious taste of winter in 2005, a point Cahill stressed before the game.

"Our courage and our endeavour was superb and the fierceness at the ball was everything a coach could want," Cahill said.

much needed confidence with 4.2 while recycled Eagle, Roc Harry, also thrived in the wet weather with 29 possessions in defence.

Not completely outclassed. the Tigers chose to take the Magpies on rather than trying to put the clamps on the likes of Clayton and Elstone.

And when the tireless Heath Culpitt (38 disposals) and Brett Backwell (29) did manage to get their hands on the football, they lacked a major target across halfforward to aim at, a point which wasn't lost on coach Peter Simmons.

"We were second to the football early in the first quarter and we couldn't get it to work across the halfforward line and that just killed us," Simmons said.

"We just couldn't get any marking power and we just couldn't hold the ball in our forward area, so that's where we really fell down."




