A GRITTY seven-point win over Glenelg on Saturday secured bragging rights for the Panthers in the southern derby.

As the club strives to become the power in the south of the city, coach Robert Pyman is working on making Noarlunga Oval a fortress no team wants to visit.

Last season South had an abysmal 1-8 record at home, while just over halfway through this season Pyman's men have a 4-2 tally.

"I thought it was one of those games which

was up for grabs and I thought the commitment the players showed was exceptional," Pyman said.

"It wasn't pretty but it was good old-fashioned footy that was an arm wrestle all day.

"They kept coming at us and they kept challenging us but to the boys' credit I thought the way they finished the game with a never-say-die attitude was really good."

Two players who exemplified the fighting spirit Pyman is working on were Michael Davis

and Clinton King.

"We kept rotating our on-ballers and I thought those two (Davis and King) in particular in the second half were very good," he said.

Glenelg now must pick itself up and look ahead to another huge clash in the context of their season - this time against Sturt at Unley Oval.

"We'll have a pretty standard week (on the track)," coach Peter Simmons said. "We'll be heading to a small ground which will probably be a little heavy."

South hangs on to end its losing streak

SOUTH Adelaide snapped a three-game losing streak at home to Glenelg with a hard-fought seven-point win over the Tigers at Noarlunga Oval yesterday.

A gallant Glenelg pushed the Panthers for much of the game, threatening to increase the streak to four in the final quarter, but South did enough to hang on to the valuable competition points.

Glenelg was rocked before the first bounce with the withdrawal of the influential Matthew Bode because of flu and Jacob Schuback with a foot injury.

The Tigers kicked to the southern end of Noarlunga Oval with the aid of a slight breeze but it was South which posted the game's first goal.

In the fourth minute, South's Scott McGlone and Glenelg's Luke Panozzo were involved in some push and shove in the Glenelg forward line when high contact on the Panther led to a free kick to Ben Warren at the opposite end of the ground.

The league's leading scorer slotted the goal without trouble to send the Panthers on their way.

The Tigers then hit the post twice before recording their first goal, thanks to Heath Culpitt, following some strong Glenelg pressure in its attacking 50m.

However, South then took control of the quarter, sparked by a solid mark and goal to Warren.

The home side went in at the first break 14 points in front.

South then took control of the game for 20 minutes of the second quarter, making cleaner possessions count on the scoreboard.

By the 18-minute mark, the Panthers pushed the lead out to 27 points on the back of two goals from strong-marking Brent Tuckey, while at the other end Gerrard Bennett was the key player in helping to keep Glenelg goalless.

His work on Matthew Duldig throughout the match was outstanding, restricting the Tiger forward to just four points.

But two late goals to Glenelg then put the game back up for grabs and that is where it stayed for the remainder of the contest.

The first two goals of the third term to Glenelg - including a monster 65m effort by David Mitchell - put it within three points.

But the Tigers were unable to capitalise on their time in possession and South did enough to keep their noses in front.

The lights went on for the

final term and with two goals to one, three quarters of the way through, Glenelg looked as if it was going to steal the game.

The Panthers seemed to stop dead but Clinton King and Michael Davis refused to follow the lead of their teammates and continued to run at the Tigers.

It was Tom Hateley who sealed the match for the blue and whites, kicking a long goal from a tight angle with only minutes remaining.

South coach Robert Pyman credited the win to a solid team effort.

"I thought we really played as a team today," Pyman said.

"I didn't think there were too many stand-outs, I thought we just battled on.

"We had a never-say-die attitude and showed some real heart today.

"I was really rapt with the way they went about it."
