Bosses proud after Bay thriller





EAGLES coach Ron Fuller and his Glenelg counterpart Tony Burgess preached a similar message after the Eagles' thrilling three-point triumph at Brighton Rd yesterday.

Both spoke of admiration for their troops in adverse conditions. The Eagles went into the contest decimated by injury and illness, the Tigers fragile after a string of poor performances and internal strife.

"I'm proud of the blokes who found a way to win," Fuller said.

"I'm proud of what the boys did today as far as their commitment, desperation and discipline," Burgess said.

That said, there is no doubt both would be relieved men. The Eagles would have conceded top spot on the premiership ladder with a loss while Burgess is a candidate for the Tigers' coaching role next season and has little time to prove his credentials at this level.

This was certainly a contest littered with acts of bravery and an abundance of players only too willing to fight for the cause.

The Eagles, aided by a strong breeze, opened impressively and raced to a four-goal advantage after just 12 minutes. Small forward Vince Rugolo nailed two early goals in an ominous start. He finished with eight majors.

Tireless Adam Fisher. Troy Butcher across halfback and Matthew Reavill up forward were outstanding as Glenelg piled on six unanswered goals to secure a half-time lead.

Despite Paul Lindsay's domination in the ruck and the impact of Rugolo and could not shake the persistent Tigers with the wind in the third quarter.

The Eagles scrambled to a 12-point lead in the opening minutes of the last term but the home side, heavily criticised in recent weeks for woeful form, refused to concede. Their efforts were not helped, however, by some inconsistent umpiring, especially from Tim Pfeiffer.

"At three-quarter time it


Justin Cicolella, the Eagles looked ominous but they found a way and it is a great credit to the character of the blokes," Fuller said.
