Bays boss won't be ringing changes

GLENELG coach Peter Simmons will not ring the changes to tackle flag contender Sturt on Sunday despite suffering his third straight loss on Saturday.

The Bays had 38 more kicks, 32 more handballs and one more scoring shot yet lost to South Adelaide by 24 points at home.

Brad Stephens popped his shoulder out but Simmons expects him back next week, saying "that always happens - he's had that dodgy shoulder for six or seven years".

He also wouldn't be surprised if he lost midfielder Steven Salopek, who had 23 disposals, to Port Adelaide Power, which is struggling for depth with a raft of injuries.

"I wouldn't predict that there's going to be changes from this week to next week," Simmons said.

But while reserved after the loss, the

first-year coach could not hide his disappointment, saying finishing rather than fitness or focus was the problem.

"(The game) gave the club an opportunity to springboard their season, to put South back in their place a little bit after they were being talked up all week for beating Central," he said. "We had more of the ball than them, more forward entries, more shots on goal, we just gave it away. To fall over in the last 10 minutes and lose by 20-odd points is very disappointing."

South Adelaide coach Robert Pyman said his team showed incredible character to win.

"The win was very character building," he said.

"It was a fantastic win in light of the fact that for the first three quarters we were quite off our game. But when the game was there to be won they stepped up to the plate."

Warren buries South

WHAT a difference a full-forward makes.

South Adelaide's Ben Warren has gone from a boy to a man in the space of a year, and yesterday he kicked a flawless 5.0, including a telling mark in the last quarter that signalled the Panthers gaining the ascension after an arm-wrestle that lasted most of the day.

Warren played as a key forward last season but this year he has grown into the target South badly needed.

Yesterday, he was the major force for South coming home like a train, as the Panthers kicked the last four goals of the game to win 18.12 (120) to 13.18 (96).

Before yesterday, Warren led the SANFL's goalkicking with 18.

The Panthers had Brent Tuckey (2.1), Thomas Hedge and late inclusion Mark Demasi (2.0) to assist and form a potent forward line that blew the game open in the last quarter.

"Benny has been good for us and has played consistent football," South coach Robert Pyman, whose Panthers have now won three games straight, said.

South kept the Bays in the game with lapses in concentration after crushing premier Central District and cellar-dweller Norwood in the past two weeks.

Glenelg lost key forward Bradley Stephens after his troublesome shoulder popped out in the third quar-

ter from a solid bump by Scott Webb.

South was on top early but simple errors caused too many turnovers and 16 minutes into the third term Glenelg hit the front.

Though Warren pegged one back to regain the lead for South, the Bays' intentions were clear - they fired out of the blocks after half-time as they kicked three out of the third term's first four majors.

Despite a huge third term in which Glenelg booted 7.5 and had 20 more disposals than the visitors, the Bays could not get a run-on as South refused to let the feisty Bays run away with it, going goal for goal.

Glenelg won the third term through dominating the midfield. Brett Backwell finished the term in a flurry, kicking two goals in the space of a minute, his second

- the result of a massive ruck knock by Jeff Smith - sailing through as the siren went for the last break.

Warren and Alwyn Davey, a Darwin recruit and the brother of Melbourne AFL star Aaron, have been the Panthers' most improved this season.

Davey has similar freakish talent to his brother but was at times too cute for his own good, kicking 1.4 yesterday.

The Bays also were woefully inaccurate in the first term and this continued to plague them in the second - they had an equal amount of scoring shots as South (16) yet trailed by 15 points.

But South could not punish them for it and stopped running for a 10-minute period that allowed Glenelg to bang on three goals and get to within 10 points in the second quarter.
