A WIN can often hide a multitude of sins but Glenelg's 30-point victory against Norwood on Saturday could not mask its inability to kill off a team.

Leading by a matchwinning margin of 52 points at the final change, the Tigers were perfectly placed to smash the Redlegs, instead choosing to switch off and allow the visitors to regain some respect.

And it was the second week in succession Glenelg produced an almost effortless final quarter, following round six's capitulation to Sturt.

It soured a brilliant third term, in which the Tigers gained complete control of the contest through more desperation to win the 50-50 duels and drying up Norwood's scoring.

"For whatever reason we've done it again and played terrible football
