Jarman says he has something up his sleeve

SATURDAY'S entertaining 43-goal shootout between North Adelaide and Glenelg - won by the Roosters by four points - made two things crystal clear for both teams.

Their attacks can score freely but both outfits sorely need another tall key player to shore up their defences. Roosters coach Andrew Jarman says he has another trick to pull to solve his problem but counterpart Mark Mickan will have to manufacture a solution.

He has lost half-back Ryan Willits (197cm) to the AFL and with the Power's long injury list he is unlikely to come back to face Central District at Elizabeth on Saturday from 6.30pm. The stand-out form of North's Clint Alleway (12 marks), Ian Perrie (13) and Daniel Hargraves (five), who had time on the bench, forced Mickan to move Jeff Smith to defence but that weakened his attack.

Debutant utility Mark Austin (192cm), 17, was overwhelmed, now Mickan has to be creative.

"That's the system - you can't keep relying on AFL players because they won't always be there," Mickan said. "We have no shortage of big blokes in the club, it's just a matter of what roles we give them and how we balance our team."

Glenelg is third on the ladder with 10 wins, equal with Central and the Magpies, and one win ahead of fast-finishing South Adelaide and the Tigers have a bye to come. Playing finals is not certain.

Jarman is contemplating the double-chance with key defenders Steven Koops out of touch and Shane Schubert in the reserves on Saturday. He has experimented with Hargraves in defence and he might go that way again ... and he might not.

"I've got something up my sleeve," said Jarman, who's eager for Saturday's challenge against South. "We've still got to work on the defensive side of our game. I might have something else and you'll be surprised."

Defenders Brett White (groin) and Nick Gill (calf) should be fit to face South.

North crowing in pressure-cooker

TIRELESS and bold North Adelaide conjured an amazing double-comeback to drain the life out of the fighting Tigers and win by four points in a tense and free-flowing 43-goal shootout at Glenelg Oval yesterday.

The Roosters trailed by eight points 20 minutes into the highly-entertaining last quarter but pulled out all stops and forced a handful of errors from the fatigued Tigers defence, turning what could have been a gallant loss into a morale-boosting win.

North kicked 21.20 (146) for and Glenelg 22.10 (142) but the lead changed just three times.

The scores were no more than five points apart for the final seven, high-intensity minutes when the ball flew from one end of the oval to the other on a half-a-dozen occasions.

With three key forwards - Clint Alleway (5.1), Daniel Hargraves (5.1) and the Crows' Ian "Sarge" Perrie (6.2) - firing non-stop, North took the lead by three points after Perrie slotted his second goal in as many minutes in time-on but the fight was far from over.

Dean Howard and heath Younie added points from 40m out to give North a five-point buffer. Seconds later Ben Mules intercepted a loose handpass from Daniel Ebert, who was under extreme pressure about 40m from the northern goal, but the Tigers skipper missed on

the run to bring the Roosters' lead back to four points.

The immediate kick-in ended with speedster Leigh Ryswyk, who was running flat-chat into North's half-forward line to end a cut-throat win.

The win put North equal on wins with Woodville-West Torrens, which faces Norwood today, and two wins clear of Glenelg in third spot.

It was a courageous victory and one Roosters coach Andrew Jarman said should build a solid foundations for a genuine finals assault.

"You learn a lot from games like this, I do," he said. "They (North) can dig

deep, they stuck to the structure when under pressure and they still had some run in their legs ... they all played their part.

"Our so-called supporter - who reckon they're supporters - said 'we won't win another game with Hargraves, Perrie and Alleway in the same team' ... well, we knew we could."

Glenelg coach Mark Mickan said: "The effort was terrific but there were things that happened during the day that required more poise, more calm - defining moments throughout the game where we could have been better when we had possession".
