SOUTH Adelaide's frustrating absence from finals action is over after overpowering Glenelg by 49 points at Adelaide Oval yesterday.

In a battle to confirm the fifth component of the finals series beginning next week, the Panthers overcame a half-time deficit to earn their first major round appearance since 1992.

The win lifted the Panthers to third on the ladder although Central District can regain that spot when it takes on West Adelaide today.

"That was an early final as far as we were concerned," South Adelaide coach Robert Pyman said.

"We need to be proud of this group of players."

Maybe it was nerves, maybe it was the blustery conditions, but the first quarter was marred by skills errors and poor disposal.


Pinpointing foot passes was a difficult task as both sides continually turned the ball over. The sides struggled to adapt to the tricky conditions and it was the Tigers who settled better.

ad Sundqvist. In his previous nine league games he failed to register a goal. Yet in the second quarter he nailed five in an amazing performance.

The Tigers were surer with

their hands, hungrier for the ball and far more decisive. Too often the Panthers stood back and allowed
