MAYBE the time has come for the SANFL to subsidise North Adelaide coach Andrew Jarman's contract.

Okay, that's not serious but there is no better promoter of SANFL football than the former Crows star. His methods are based purely on entertainment attack, attack and more attack. And no more evident was his thoughts on how the game should be played than at Glenelg Oval yesterday when the Roosters overcame a spirited Tigers by 37 points. It was a shootout emphasising Jarman's motives - the Roosters will pursue a high goal tally and if the opponent can outdo them, then good luck.

Glenelg had a crack - a fair-dinkum crack - but it could not match the class of the visitors for four quarters.

Fans feasted on 40 goals, 18 of which came in an amazing second quarter. Even Glenelg supporters would have gone home satisfied with the entertainment value of an enthralling struggle.

"A lot of SANFL football is now played by sides that are starting to believe, now hang on, we got sucked into that negative chip-chip sideways, wishy-washy football that is being delivered by the AFL," Jarman said. "A lot of the clubs are starting to think, let's play attacking. attractive footy. It is about entertainment. Yes, you have to have some sort of defensive component in your game but when you play North Adelaide, you have to be good at taking us on."

Glenelg's pre-game plan to match the Roosters' ability to kick big numbers was to win the ball at the contest, deny them possession while at the same time providing their own scoring chances.

And the theory worked for the first half when an enthusiastic, revitalised Glenelg outfit stood up to a side deserving of at least equal premiership favouritism with Port Adelaide Magpies.

Thomas Logan and Adam Fisher were among the desperate Tigers who challenged the talent-laden Roosters with their attack on the body and ball.

"I have no complaints about the commitment of the players." Tigers coach Mark Mickan said "Skill execution, skill errors and a few missed tackles cost us.

"A lot of things which cost us the game were errors we were not beaten because we were not good enough. It was a good experience for the club.

"We can still feel as though we belong against a side which has set itself up as the early favourite."

After securing a 21-point buffer at three-quarter time, the North machine slipped into full gear in the final term. With Josh Francou and Dean Howard feeding the runners like Scott Bamford, the Roosters' impressive forward line took control.

Nick Gill is a courageous star and Owen Weatherley is strong at the marking contest.


Both worried the Glenelg defence all day.


