Players deserve the credit: Mickan

GLENELG coach Mark Mickan has thrown all the credit for the Tigers' resurgence to the players.

While his methods in his first season with the club have had a significant impact, Mickan said the players were responsible for anything that has changed.

After struggling for too long in the eyes of supporters, the Tigers clinched their third win from five games this season when they overcame South Adelaide by 10 points in an entertaining battle at Noarlunga Oval on Saturday.

The Tigers have adopted an efficient attacking system under Mickan, using the ball more effectively and with greater patience. Not only that, they are playing with tremendous enthusiasm and commitment to the jumper.

"The players have to take the credit for what they have achieved," Mickan said. "We have set up a leadership group with standards they have set on and off the field.

"They are responsible for anything that has changed - they are the ones that do it on the field and execute what we talk about. Mature clubs expect to win and play in a fashion that reflects that. We are training that way - training with desperation and urgency. If you get that each week you get a pretty competitive effort." Mickan said there had been an emphasis on decision making with the ball and skills.

He has stressed the importance of not giving up the ball, ensuring kicks and handballs count.

That is a message Panthers coach Robert Pyman will be ramming home to his squad this week after a spate of turnovers.

Too often players coughed up possession with poor decisions and woeful skill errors.

And that is extremely costly against a committed, confident and well-drilled outfit such as Glenelg - most of which is the result of Mickan and his coaching staff's outstanding work.
