BRAVE and desperate Sturt caused a major upset with a thrilling one-point victory over Glenelg at Brighton Road yesterday.

The Double Blues, second from the bottom and besieged by injuries and suspension to key players, cast aside a season of-disappointing form to secure just their second win.

"I thought the personnel we had going into the game wasn't too bad," Sturt coach Brenton Phillips said.

"This win is fantastic for the club. We have been knocked around a little bit.

"I'm happy for the playing group. The best part about football is seeing blokes with smiles on their faces. That is what a win can do to a football club."

The umpires were forced to have five ball-ups to clear the square to open the game, but the entertainment then flowed as both sides attacked the contest.

Glenelg went into the battle a hot favourite but the Double Blues, with Jade Sheedy and Andrew Whiteman superb on the ball, accepted the challenge with en-

thusiasm and commitment. Skill errors, mostly with handball, hurt Sturt early as it struggled to find fluency

into the forward line. In contrast, the Tigers looked far more potent going into attack.

Glenelg, well led by acting captain Adam Fisher and with Brett Backwell working hard to find space, was more precise and decisive with its delivery. And Matthew Duldig thrived on the opportunities, using his strong marking to cause headaches for the Sturt defence.

Both sides showed willingness to get involved in the heavy work, ensuring plenty of pressure for combatants.

Seven minutes into the second quarter, promising youngster Tom Hurley showed his class with a goal which cut Glenelg's lead to just eight points and seemed to spark Sturt.

The Double Blues lifted their skill level and became surer with their ball work to put Glenelg under the pump.

While Sturt grew in confidence, the Tigers' skills dropped and poor decision making proved-costly.

Moving James McLeay on to Duldig also had a huge impact.

If the action was not hot enough, late in the second quarter tempers became heated with a swag of players involved in a brawl.

The momentum swings continued into the third term with firstly Sturt in control. The fierce tackling of the Double Blues quelled the Tigers' running game, while the home side did not help its cause with overuse of handball and clumsy football.

Glenelg then grabbed the ascendancy before the Double Blues bagged the last three goals of the quarter to regain the high ground.

With the home side dominating the stoppages in the last quarter, the Tigers went on the prowl with constant ferays deep into attack.

Sturt struggled to clear its defence as the Tigers levelled the scores midway through the term.

"Credit to Sturt, its pressure was good, no doubt about that," Glenelg coach Mark Mickan said.

"They deserve their win. "They were more efficent with the ball, decision making and skill level. So they get the result."
