Moore backbone

PERSISTENCE pays in football and there was no greater example of this than Glenelg's Ben Moore at the Bay yesterday.

As his beloved Tigers held a slender four-point lead in the third term, Moore's miracle goal in the 15th minute epitomised the never-say-die attitude of his team-mates. The former captain burrowed his way to the bottom of the pack, got tackled not once but twice, somehow emerged to his feet and ran into an open goal from 10 metres out.

Not only did Moore set the tone for his comrades through sheer desperation but he also backed it up with another major in the next minute as the Tigers burst to a 16-point lead in the premiership quarter. While his work was undone when the equally determined Redlegs booted the final three goals of the term to close the gap to four points at the final change, Moore proved if you never give in the reward will come. And it did in the form of a gutsy 13-point victory.

"Ben Moore's third quarter was really important," Glenelg coach Mark Mickan said.

"His pressure around the ball and those goals and opportunities he created up there were just through sheer grunt. That's why we love him."

No doubt the Tigers' belief, as a result of Moore's persistence, became equally as important in the nail-biting final term when there were eight behinds scored between the two teams in the opening 13 minutes.

It took the game-breaking feats of elusive Tiger Justin

McConnell (6.2) to break the deadlock as he booted the first of three of his team's four, final-term majors to seal the dramatic win.

"He (McConnell) also applied some really good forward pressure and that's something that's really added to his game," Mickan said.

David Mitchell (3.1) showed what he can do when he is prepared to lift his workrate while Tom Logan and Adam Fisher were as hard as nails.

Brave Norwood, which suffered from losing Stuart Bown to a first-half neck injury, continually tried to peg the hosts back, largely through the efforts of Crows-listed pair Bryce Campbell and Darren Pfeiffer.

But as Pfeiffer surged with an attacking last term, Campbell was rested in the forward line because he was "spent", according to Norwood coach Trevor Hill.

"I thought both teams were persistent but it was pretty much an error-ridden game and to Glenelg's credit they made fewer errors," Hill said.

"There was a lot riding on it and I think that brings a lot of disappointment. I'm just disappointed because I thought we had enough opportunities to snatch a win."

But once again, it came down to the quality which Ben Moore showed so admirably as the Tigers put themselves in the box seat for a finals berth.

"It was all on the line today and to Norwood's credit their persistence was good but so was ours and that's probably what won it for us in the end," Mickan said.
