#### DOUG ROBERTSON

COOL-HEADED Norwood kept its revival running hot and bounced into the top five for the first time this season with a fighting 33-point win over Glenelg at The Parade last night.

The rain stayed away and Norwood unleashed its emerging hard-running, quick-delivery style in a match-deciding 5.4-to-1.2 third term that blew the stuffing out of the error-ridden Tigers who simply relied on too few to do too much.

It was Norwood's third consecutive win and although its stay among the league's best might be short – depending on the result of the North Adelaide-Port Adelaide clash at Alberton today – it showed enough character, class and sheer grunt to suggest it's worthy of top-five billing.

The Legs had to scrap to shrug off the Tigers and some bedazzling umpiring decisions, especially in the first half when the Legs collected four frees to 15 – two were for out-on-thefull – along with its own clumsiness.

But once Norwood cleaned up the ball-handling it was smooth sailing and the running Redlegs posted 9.7 to Glenelg's 4.3 (three goals to Luke Panozzo) after half-time by feasting on a glut of simple ball-handling mistakes.

The lead changed seven times in a sloppy first half and was tied three times. Norwood hit the front nine minutes into the third term when gutsy Stuart Bown – in a dogfight with Ruory Kirkby in the first half – kicked the second of three goals for the night. Ten minutes later when Bown kicked

his third from 50 metres out – off one step – the margin was 24 points and the Legs were gathering confidence with every foray.

The moment was even more significant because seconds earlier Glenelg had had eight unbroken kicks-andmarks and the ball was still inside Norwood's attacking 50m arc. When the gang-tackling Legs forced the turnover they made the Tigers feel the pain.


Former Glenelg on-baller Heath Culpitt (17 disposals, three tackles) was tough and relentless and used the ball well in the crushes. Kris Massie ran hard and had his rewards in a productive second half, Stephen Bailey, Kieran McGuinness and Luke Nitschke ran off at ease and used the space given to them and Jesse Aish came to life exhibiting the skills of a budding champion.

Glenelg got little from its AFL-listed additions with Josh Mahoney (seven disposals) and Richard Douglas (10) quiet and John Hinge unable to make an impact. The Tigers had three goalscorers (Norwood had eight) with usual defender Panozzo (6.1) the main contributor to highlight a lack of forward targets capable of taking a strong mark or – more crucially – even holding the ball in the attacking area.
