HEN Glenelg coach Mark Mickan labelled his players workmen it was to describe a mob of blokes who took a simple and honest approach to their football.

When North Adelaide coach Andrew Jarman used the same word it was meant as praise for the Tigers' committed, hard-working mental endeavour.

It was just that sort of resolve Jarman, disappointed and frustrated with his players, lamented as lacking in his squad after suffering a 57-point loss to Glenelg at Prospect yesterday.

It was just that sort of resolve Mickan knows has driven his club to the top of the SANFL premiership table and sparked rampant expectation among the club faithful.

A couple of weeks ago star Tigers on-baller Matthew Bode commented the Bays were a side devoid of party tricks. Just a well bonded bunch of mates going about their business with enthusiasm and total dedication to the cause.

Mickan had another definition for his side: "We are not millionaires in a football

"We have to remember what makes us play good football and that is being workmanlike.

"The players were workmanlike again and that is what we have to remember - who we really are as footballers and as a team.

"We are just workmen and if we work together we can get a result."

If Glenelg loses ruckman Trevor Cranston the club is in trouble, make no mistake about that.

He has been sensational

Again he ignited the side with his dominance at the stoppages, allowing the likes of vastly-improved Ty Allen and Ben Kane to get busy in the midfield.

The Roosters had a serious crack at the competition pacesetter in the first half to trail by just eight points.

James Allan and Rhys Archard had an influence, while Luke Ivens and Greg Gallman were resolute in defence. Too often, however, opportunities were wasted by the Roosters with poor disposal going into attack and that is disastrous against a composed, disciplined and well-drilled Glenelg.

The Tigers' defence, led by Ben Mules, is uncompromising and it runs the ball out of the danger zone with purpose and precision. That was

evident in the third term when the visitors seized control with six goals in 15 minutes of impressive football.

Victorian recruit Todd Grima is a potent weapon with his strong hands, whether it is deep in attack or further up the ground where he roamed yesterday to provide a powerful link from defence to attack. What the Tigers do well is set up players such as Adam Fisher just outside the defensive 50m ready to provide the rebound. While the Roosters struggled with their ball movement under the relentless Glenelg pressure, their opponents never deviated from Mickan's instructions.

Jarman's words tell much of the second-half story.

"It is becoming more of a mental issue with how strong these boys are mentally," he said. "Who's prepared to stay over the ball, who's prepared to just take themselves away from the hard contest when it is their turn to go.

"Glenelg had real, hard committed runners ... just never flinched. It is a working club - working-class and they pride themselves on doing the hard things. We are not good enough for the top three. I don't think at this stage we are good enough to be a topfive side unless we start to make a commitment for the next six to eight weeks."
