THE Bulldogs are back in town. Reigning premiers Central District issued a timely reminder to the rest of the competition with a 45-point win over Glenelg at Elizabeth last night.

With just six weeks until the finals, the Bulldogs showed they will again be a serious contender for a seventh title in nine years.

Should Sturt beat Woodville-West Torrens at Unley today, the Double Blues will claim top spot on the ladder from the Tigers.

In contrast to their previous clash in Round 12, the Bulldogs opened with far greater intent to challenge the Tigers with a brand of football which has made them the modern-day power of the SANFL.

The Bulldogs have been guilty of lacklustre endeavour in the first half of the season but they attacked with a renewed ferocity during last night's clash.

Onballer Chad O'Sullivan - among the few consistent performers - continued his outstanding form while Ryan Williams and Adam Switala were prominent.

Power-listed Matthew Westhoff had an influence in attack as the home side asked plenty of questions of the Tigers.

The Bulldogs moved the ball with confidence and too often found loose team-mates across the midfield who provided the drive into attack.

Glenelg's defence was under plenty of pressure but the likes of Luke Panozzo were able to work the ball out of the danger zone. However the visitors' movement broke down across half forward with poor decision-making or untidy delivery.

When Bulldogs midfielder Ian Callinan goaled seven minutes in the second quarter, Glenelg's lack of intensity was exposed in worrying signs for the visitors.

While the Bulldogs worked hard to find space, the Tigers

lacked the same work ethic and constantly broke down in attack. Despite their dominance, Central District failed to capitalise on the scoreboard and, after leading by just eight points at quarter-time, stretched the margin by only 17 at half-time.

Glenelg coach Mark Mickan moved Panozzo into attack in third term and he gave the Bulldogs' defence headaches as the Tigers closed the gap to 18 points midway through the quarter.

The Bulldogs - refusing to buckle - responded to the Tigers' charge and the gap was 31 points going into the final quarter.

The advantage ballooned to 37 just two minutes into the final period when Westhoff bagged his fifth goal.

Panozzo continued to be the only seriously threatening option with too many team-mates struggling to get into the contest.
