# Mickan's message gives Tigers big lift

XECUTION is the new buzz word at Glenelg after the Tigers broke away from a pesky West Adelaide to win by 54 points at Challenge Recruitment Oval yesterday.

As his charges trudged from the field at half-time trailing by a point, Tigers coach Mark Mickan knew his message during the main change had to be loud and clear. And with the word execution ringing in their ears, the Tigers turned on a game-breaking seven-goal third term as they went long and direct - with pace - on their way to sealing their second victory in 2008.

"It was just to keep at it and not get frustrated, that you have to keep your head about you," Mickan said when quizzed about his influential half-time speech. "You have to keep focusing on moving the ball quickly because that's what everyone wants to do and if you do it well you tend to score better.


"That's what we wanted to do and I thought that execution was pretty good (in the third term)."

Suddenly this brought all four of Glenelg's key forwards into the game and not just hard-working Matthew Duldig. Todd Grima, Ruory Kirkby and James Sellar all had their moments in the second half while Justin McConnell was his creative self on his way to a game-high 4.2. But without the tireless effort of Tom Holmes and Ty Allen in the centre square their aerial supremacy would not have been possible. The two midfield lesser-lights played four solid quarters, thanks largely to stoic ruckman Trevor Cranston.

While the popular big man failed to register a kick, he dominated West's Shane Neaves at the stoppages as his 22 to five hit-out count indicated.

"He's always like that - his second efforts are his trademark and he creates opportunities for other players with his ruckwork," Mickan said of Cranston.

With Cranston looming large, West's midfield was forced to work harder and there was only a handful of Bloods to

take up the challenge. James Ezard and Salim Hassan – who seemed everywhere before half-time - managed just one handball and two kicks between them after the main break. This left Power forward Robbie Gray - who spent significant periods working strongly in the midfield - Ben Hollands and Stephen Bailey to pick up the slack.

It wasn't enough as the Bloods – much like last round against South Adelaide switched off when it mattered most.

"Again, it's becoming a bit of a story which I'm getting frustrated with," West coach Andy Collins said. "So we'll experiment with our combinations but they (players) can't be doing that and not have consequences for their actions."

Nuggety Rick Giles came off the bench and provided a second-term spark for West, booting three goals in succession while captain Nathan Brown also battled hard in defence.
