Bays message is loud and clear

LENELG gave
Central District a healthy
dose of its own
medicine at
Challenge Recruitment
Oval yesterday, defeating
the Dogs by three points in
a hard-fought battle.

The Tigers claimed victory through tackling hard and locking up play in their forward 50 metre arc, both distinctive tactics characteristic of a firing Bulldogs side.

With three of its key players sidelined – captain Paul Thomas, Ian Callinan and Chris Gowans – Central had little zing left in its midfield.

However, Glenelg did not always take full grasp of its opportunities and in particular failed to close the game much earlier than it could have, kicking six points in the final 10 minutes of the game.

Tigers coach Mark Mickan applauded the team's determination and intensity that has pushed it quickly up the SANFL ladder with four consecutive wins.

"We've certainly worked on that aspect (intensity) ... but we're still aspiring to play a tough four quarters," he said.

"If there's a drop off in our intensity, you certainly notice it. But our strength today was through our clearances."

Glenelg's Trevor Cranston continued to set a very high benchmark for the league in hit-outs and claimed 30 alone compared to the Bulldogs' total of 22.

This, teamed with the ferocity offered by allrounder Brett Backwell and gutsy rover Adam Fisher proved to be nearly unstoppable in the centre square.

Former Crow Matthew Bode was unseasonably quiet, although he still managed 23 touches.

He added depth to the Glenelg midfield and helped the Tigers to 62 inside 50s compared to the Bulldogs' 42 (20 of which were in the third quarter).

Feeding to forward Justin McConnell was a dream, the 26-year-old taking a couple of spectacular contested marks and kicking with 100 per cent accuracy.

Mickan said the squad was starting to "execute our structure and style of play".

However, after losing only its first game of the season against South Adelaide, Mickan also refused to admit Glenelg was on a roll.

"I don't worry about that.

If we were running last at
this stage we wouldn't be
upset, so we don't take too

much from being in front this early either."

Glenelg has arguably replaced Central District, and even Sturt, as frontrunner of the league, with momentum working in

Bulldogs coach Roy Laird said it was a testament to the competition that there were currently so many evenly-ranked sides.

"I'd consider us middle of the table now," Laird said, a position he clearly isn't content with.


"Physically, I didn't think we were in the game at all, especially in the first half. Glenelg were also a bit flattering to us – there were a lot of times we should have been further down."

Luke McCabe, playing his first league game since retiring in 2006, was one of the hardest workers for Central, fighting for the hard-ball gets and kicking two late goals.

However, Laird said coming ready to play a full four quarters was a battle for his side.

"We don't look at the opposition," he said.

"We're looking at our mentality and that's got to change. There are no easy games."
