SANFL is alive and well, declares Jarman

DEFEATED but not deflated, North Adelaide coach Andrew Jarman's first thoughts after Saturday's loss to Glenelg were to marvel at the Roosters-Tigers rivalry.

As players and club officials absorbed a 26-point loss at the Bay-after posting 18 goals in a match that delivered 40 -the SA football Hall of Famer reflected on the contest like a fan might recall a premiership triumph.

"If you want, tell your friends that league football is alive and well and if you wanted to see an attractive, hard and committed game of football by both sides with plenty of goals, you should have been at Glenelg Oval," Jarman said. "That's what we got."

Glenelg was simply too good for North Adelaide in the Rivalry Round clash - just as the Tigers were in the 1985 and '86 grand finals, before that was reversed in the 1987 decider.

Brett Backwell, Adam Fisher and

John Hinge were brilliant for the home side while Magarey Medallist James Allan and Heath Younie (five goals) led the North resistance.

Glenelg looked set to run away with its fifth successive win in the first quarter until the Roosters responded with a blistering seven-goal second term. The Tigers stepped up again in

the third, jumping to a 50-point break. 'It was pleasing from our point of view we were able to steady and hold it together mentally in that third quarter," coach Mark Mickan said.

"We dropped off in the second quarter. We dropped off in our intensity, they scored from it and we paid the price." Jarman praised youngsters

including Matthew Wright, Gavin Grose and Damian Cunningham but said output from his experienced leaders was down.

"The thing I've got to look at is my senior group," he said. "Some of my senior players were a bit off and I need to address that. Once we get an even mix among the group we'll be okay."



Eighteen goals not enougn tor North

GLENELG fended off a stopstart North Adelaide to overrun the Roosters by 26 points in a Rivalry Round classic at the Bay yesterday.

The Tigers steamrolled North with a seven-goal third quarter and withstood two fightbacks before holding on for their fifth win of the season and anchoring themselves in the top-five.

On a day celebrating the 1980s grand final rivalry between both clubs, North finished with an 18-goal scoreline yet only rarely seemed in the contest.

With superb passing, unyielding hard work in close and a forward line full of options Glenelg burst clear late in the opening term.

Then as the Roosters rallied twice from a 50-point deficit the Tigers again stepped up to finish off last year's runner-up.

In the process Glenelg passed a significant early season test, adding North to a victim sheet that now boasts all of last year's fellow finalists - North, Woodville-West Torrens, Sturt and Cen-

tral District. "At this time of year we've played six games so position on the ladder doesn't mean much," Tigers coach Mark Mickan said.

"This time last year we were probably bottom of the ladder. We would have liked to have held our lead but our third quarter was particularly pleasing, to hold it together mentally and physically."

break into its attacking half as Glenelg dominated the midfield clearances.

Ben Kane was creative, John Hinge brought his silky skills and Brett Backwell typified the Tigers' hard running.

In the opening term they failed to take full toll on the scoreboard. Ruory Kirkby and Justin McConnell both missed shots but a Nathan Lonie kick from the Roosters' last line of defence was chopped off by Adam Fisher to put Glenelg 13 points clear. When McConnell goaled twice immediately after the danger signs were obvious for the Roosters.

James Allan gave North its first major close to time-on in the first term and Heath Younie - who finished with five important goals - added another within seconds of the centre bounce to slice the deficit.

But the revival only served to spark a four-goal Tigers surge, giving the home side a 38-point break at the first huddle.

Allan and Younie combined again to lift North as the visitors cut a six-goal margin to just one in a brilliant second term.

But the Tigers responded in brutal fashion, slamming on the first six of the third term.

When James Sellar notched his first at the 14-minute mark the Tigers had a 42-point lead - the biggest of the match - and by the time Matthew Bode added his second Glenelg was in total control.

Damon White and Rhys Archard chimed in with goals in the closing quarter as North drew to within four goals but it was too little, too late.

"The funny thing is, 18 goals wins you a game. That's the weird thing about it and that's why we're all having a drink," North coach Andrew Jarman said.


"We're a little bit dumbstruck. I don't know what Glenelg Oval does to us.'
