GLENELG significantly pushed its claim to be tagged premiership favourite after a highly impressive 42-point victory over Sturt at Adelaide Oval last night.

The Tigers adopted a tremendous work ethic and desperate teamwork to claim their sixth successive win and kick two games clear of the second-placed Double Blues and Central District on the ladder.

The Bulldogs, who have played two matches less, can get back within one game of the Tigers when they take on North Adelaide at Elizabeth today.

Sturt's reputation has taken a dent in the past two weeks, following an 85-point thrashing of the Bulldogs with beltings from the Roosters and Glenelg.

The Double Blues nailed the opening goal four minutes into last night's contest when Charlie Sharples, back in the side after a lengthy stint in the reserves, pounced on a loose ball.

But the smiles belonged to Tigers supporters from there with Glenelg, well led by Ben Mules, taking control with the type of disciplined performance demanded from coach Mark Mickan.

Hard-working ruckman Trevor Cranston and his Glenelg on-ball mates continually retrieved the ball from the stoppages to spark a flood of attacking raids.

Presented with an abundance of opportunities, John Hinge provided a strong target at centre halfforward while full forward Todd Grima was also dangerous.

Midway through the opening

term Tiger Chris Kane produced a rare moment of undisciplined football when he was reported for allegedly striking Patrick Fittock, who was forced to leave the ground under the blood rule.

However, his team-mates stuck to the task with committed focus and put Sturt under constant pressure with a relentless attack on the body and ball. The Double Blues were given little freedom to operate and on the few occasions they did break clear, poor skills were a concern, especially with delivery deep into attack.

It took Sturt 17 minutes into the second term to kick its second goal while gun full forward Brant Chambers went without a possession in the first half. That was a reflection of the woeful decision-making of team-mates more so than the work of Glenelg defender Wayde Mills.

The Tigers moved the ball with efficiency and they went direct with method. No more was this evident than midway through the second term when Sturt spent five minutes on the attack for no result.


The Tigers then secured possession and raced the ball down the corridor against a powerless opponent before Ruory Kirkby marked and goalled.


