We can improve still, says Mickan

THE DROUGHT has finally broken for Glenelg.

After 10 years without victory at Woodville Oval, the in-form Tigers overcame Woodville-West Torrens by 34 points yesterday in a tough oneon-one battle.

It was a game that demanded intensity from the players, an attribute the visitors had in abundance and were not afraid to display through the congested midfield and half-back line.

And, although the Eagles remained in the contest, skill and experience won the game for Glenelg.

Senior players Byron Murphy, Ben Kane and Ty Allen led the Bays' charge with almost 80 disposals between them.

Coach Mark Mickan said his team was stretched by the Eagles but stood up to the challenge of a tough, physical contest.

"It was a difficult game because of the competitiveness and persistence of the Eagles," Mickan said.

"We're happy for a game to be oneon-one, it's just up to our blokes to take that on and still play our style of game."

Glenelg dominated at the stoppages, winning the hit-outs 59 to Woodville-West Torrens' 28. Yet the Bays' best work was arguably seen on the half-back line where players built a wall, creating pressure and forcing turnovers by the Eagles.

The premiership quarter was when Glenelg really broke the game open, with six goals to the Eagles' two. Todd Grima was an imposing option up forward for the Bays with his ability to take a strong, contested

At the other end, Woodville-West Torrens' Nick Salter also impressed, not just with his accurate shots on goal but with a consistent work ethic and effective second attempts.

Mickan said the Tigers could still improve in shutting down the opposition consistently however he felt the side had advanced in comparison to the same time last year.

"As a group we had a very good third quarter but our last and second quarters were not quite as good as we would have liked so that's an area we have to address," he said.

"We've been reasonably consistent and we've got a group of players

together who are playing their roles reasonably well. I think we've made progress - we're in a position we'd like to be in but we can still improve."

For the injury-ravaged Eagles it was a game that showed promise and courage in periods. But with a young side filling the shoes of the usual "star" players - and five of the six spots in the leadership group - taking on surging Glenelg was a big ask.

"I didn't think we were brave

enough in the third quarter when we had a bit of a breeze and needed to tough it out," coach Ron Fuller said.

"It was certainly encouraging but they outclassed us. (Tough) is the way we like to play, it's the way Glenelg like to play and it's the way you have to play to win finals."

Fuller said with a bit more "polish" and experience he expected his side to still be a contender for a top-three position on the SANFL ladder.
