Bays fire as Blues crash back to earth

GLENELG supporters can cringe as much as they like at the favouritism tag.

But it is a fact they have to accept after conquering Sturt by 24 points with a disciplined, team-orientated performance at Unley yesterday.

A tremendous work ethic, so typical of the Glenelg outfit under coach Mark Mickan, is the foundation on which the victory was built.

The impressive triumph has enabled the Tigers to jump back into top spot on the premiership ladder - a position Central District held for just 24 hours - and be on the verge of repeating last year's minor premiership.

As for the Double Blues, it was their third loss this season against the Tigers and again raises questions over their ability to handle the tough, tight football associated with finals.

Sturt more than matched it with Glenelg in the opening half. The first-quarter effort from the home side, when it led despite running into the wind, was especially encouraging. But as Sturt coach Luke Norman noted, the Tigers were prepared to work all day. Total commitment for four quarters has still to be mastered by Sturt against last season's runner-up.

The Double Blues have lost just three of their past 23 games at Unley and two of those have been against Glenelg, providing further evidence of the Tigers' domination in recent times.

"Our workrate dropped off and we stopped doing the physical things - we weren't hitting through the contest," Norman said. "The will to work hard for team-mates really dropped off in the last half. They (Tigers) were prepared to work all day and full credit to them."

Sturt took a stand against the Bays in the opening quarter with its defence, led by Michael Coad, working overtime to continually repel Glenelg's attacking raids with the wind.

Doubles Blues skipper Jade Sheedy was his usual prominent self on the ball and the home side had the visitors under pressure.

In an entertaining, willing contest, Sturt scrambled to a 17-point lead in the second quarter after goals to Ryan Herring and Josh Cubillo, only to concede much of the advantage when Daniel Meyer nailed a goal nearing the half-time siren. Glenelg took just 30 seconds of the second half to cut the margin to just three points. Lucas Block, having a productive day for the Tigers, then sent a scare through the camp when carried from the field on a stretcher with a knee injury.

Fortunately for Block the damage was no more than a knock and he returned to the action 10 minutes later.

The game swayed between the half-forward lines before Daniel Kirk put the Tigers in front with a goal after 17 minutes of the third quarter. They would never relinquish the lead.

Glenelg, with Ty Allen and Trevor Cranston outstanding, lifted the ante and got in Sturt's face, creating doubt among the Double Blues as their skills and intensity dropped. Wayde Mills kept Sturt gun Brant Chambers to only one behind, although plenty of credit must go to the tireless defence of team-mates further afield.

By three-quarter time Glenelg had ventured into its attacking 50 arc 45 times compared to Sturt's 20 and had had 10 more scoring shots.

"It was important to get a good performance at this time of the year," Mickan said.

"The players held their nerve really well and kept at the things we wanted to do.

"We would like top spot but we never talk about it. We try to win enough games to be in the best shape possible when the finals come around."
