Boss not totally happy

WITH little left to play for it would have been easy for Glenelg to concede and rest before the finals series.

Yet, the Tigers still took to yesterday's battle at City Mazda Stadium with finesse and intensity which carried them to a 59-point victory over the Bloods.

True, the game was not as explosive as it no doubt would have been were the Bays fighting for the minor premiership or if West had a chance to snatch a spot in the finals. But there were promising passages of play for both sides that will give them something to work on in the coming months.

For Glenelg, this is far more crucial in the scheme of the 2009 season.

Pressure from the home side kept Glenelg miffed in the opening term as did the expectation of good conversion in front of goal. Poor kicking - many from set shots about 40 metres out - has been an ongoing concern for the Bays and in this case, kept the Bloods in the hunt until about the 20-minute-mark of the third term.

However, it was clear Glenelg wanted to build its intensity and control over the game from quarter-time - a feat the team achieved,

much to coach Mark Mickan's relief.

"We were fumbly early and West Adelaide were certainly at it. Once we got our ball handling a bit cleaner we were able to move the ball quicker and therefore score more easily," Mickan said.

Coming into the game with the minor premiership wrapped up, courtesy of a Central District loss at the hands of Norwood on Saturday, Mickan said it was crucial the team remained "mentally strong".

That is something the hard-working Luke Panozzo and Adam Fisher managed all day as they attacked at the stoppages and got the ball moving quickly through the centre corridor.

"The most important thing was that we played well and that we put our processes in place and play with four quarters of intensity," Mickan said.

"We weren't totally happy with it. The first quarter, even though we won it by a few points, we were scratchy and missed easy goals and didn't apply the pressure we'd like to." The forward structure continued to plague the Tigers despite the return of star Todd Grima after six weeks on the

sidelines with a broken wrist.

With 10 goalkickers for the afternoon, including one major score from diligent and dominant ruckman Trevor Cranston, it is clear the attacking arc is yet to become an area of confidence for the club.

Entry into the forward 50 is not an issue with the likes of Brett Backwell, Fisher and Ben Kane all feeding the ball in directly.

It was the opposite issue for West Adelaide, which uncovered yet another promising key position player in Matthew Martin, 19, but struggled to get the ball there cleanly.

Martin fired early for the Bloods with four majors but struggled thereafter to maintain intensity.

Bloods coach Andrew Collins said many of the club's younger players were yet to conquer physical and mental match fitness for four quarters but commended them for showing promise and initiative.

"We ask our young players to play a physical game. It's probably the hardest game to prepare for mentally too, the last game of the season."

Glenelg now has a week off to "freshen up" and will prepare for the second semi-final in a fortnight's time.
