In one of the most disappointing performances in Glenelg's history, the Tigers crashed to a heartbreaking five-point defeat against a side it had dominated for three seasons. The Bays had not lost to Sturt since round two, 2007, winning nine straight games against its preliminary final rival. But seemingly still coming to terms with its dramatic collapse against Central in the second semi Mark Mickan's outfit never really clicked into gear. Even so, it kept the Double Blues scoreless in the first term, dominating to such an extent that it had 16 inside-50s to three. Sturt took 15 minutes to invade its attacking 50 but missed opportunities in front of goal would again haunt Glenelg. The Tigers were made to pay a heavy price for their inability to capitalise on their avalanche of chances. The Double Blues goaled from five of their 13 forays inside-50 in the second term, taking a one-point lead and setting up a nailbiting second half which would become a slog. The Bays continued to rack up goalscoring chances but continued to miss, with Todd Grima kicking four straight behinds. In the end, the inability to finish cost Glenelg a grand final spot and possibly a flag.

### COACH'S COMMENTS

"Everyone is gutted and we feel we underachieved, no doubt about that. But I don't think it was a wasted year - so much effort went into it. We had opportunities all day. Kicking 7.13 is not going to win too many games and those who watched the match would have observed the areas of our game which saw us come up short of the mark. Our inconsistent use of the ball going inside 50, combined with poor finishing skills were well below an acceptable standard. These two factors prevented us from putting genuine scoreboard pressure on the opposition. To Sturt's credit, it was far more polished in these areas and it made far better use of its opportunities to score. The frustration for everyone comes from knowing that we created more than enough opportunities for ourselves but skill and decision-making errors, often unforced, let us down badly. In terms of sheer effort and attack on the ball, our players gave a very strong account of themselves. The loss has left the club's players, staff and supporters with an enormous sense of disappointment but as coach I take responsibility for the disappointing end to the season. The players have already spoken about unfinished business. They are a resilient group of young men who have a huge appetite to do the necessary hard work to bring about the improvement that is required. As coach, I will make every effort to ensure that we improve in the areas that let us down so that we are better placed in 2010 to give our supporters more to cheer about."
