# Blues overrun toothless Tigers

STURT ensured its Glenelg ghosts were well and truly buried with a crushing 39-point win at House Brothers Oval yesterday.

After failing to beat the Tigers in a minor round game for three years, and under pressure after a winless start to the season, the Double Blues responded in emphatic fashion.

Everything that once characterised Glenelg's lengthy winning streak tackling, intensity and pressure – Sturt simply did better.

"I thought they beat us at our own game, absolutely," Glenelg coach Mark Mickan said.

"They were harder at the ball than us, we couldn't hold our tackles and we fumbled too much."

Sturt had good players all over the ground, but its hardness was highlighted by three players in particular -Jace Bode, Brad Vassal and Josh Cubillo.

Bode was outstanding in stopping Glenelg playmaker Ben Kane while gathering 20 possessions of his own and kicking two goals at crucial moments. Cubillo won the hard ball while Vassal produced his best game for the club, swapping through the midfield and up forward, to earn glowing praise from coach Luke Norman.

"If you want someone to put their head over the ball, then he's your man," Norman said.

Tristan Gum had 32 quality touches for Sturt and was damaging with his run while Matthew Jaensch shone in an unfamiliar role across half back.

It was harder to find positives for Glenelg, which lacked poise and, at times, discipline.

Alex Grima continued his good start to the year with three goals, Ty Allen was great through the middle along with Chris Kane and Matthew Bode, while Ruory Kirkby provided a marking target at half forward.

After an even first term, in which Glenelg led by two points, Sturt took control.

James Plant proved an unlikely hero in front of goal, snagging two majors in the second term, and late goals to Jeremy Johncock and Brant Chambers put the Blues 33 points up at the main break.

Todd Grima tried to spark the Tigers with a goal to start the third quarter but Sturt refused to be overrun.

"The thing about pressure when you put enough of it on - is when the opposition gets the ball out in the open there is that perceived pressure and they start making rash decisions," Norman said.

"The boys, to their credit, were absolutely fantastic in that area."


But as good as Sturt was, Glenelg had a dirty day, missing easy shots and dropping what should have been straightforward marks.

Mickan said he was expecting Sturt, searching for its first win and holding a 1970 premiership reunion, to come out hungry.

"We knew their situation and they had a few things happening today that made it a good day for them," he said.

"But that was for us to come here with our own agenda and it didn't happen."

Mickan said his team was in "reasonable shape" at quarter time, but fell away quickly.
