No winner in race for fifth

SOUTH Adelaide and Glenelg both threw away golden opportunities to take control of the race for fifth spot in the first draw of the SANFL season at Noarlunga last night.

Nathan Daniel's goal with just seconds remaining tied the score at 16.6 (102) apiece and capped a wild final quarter which included 13 goals, five lead changes and one report.

Glenelg was poised to boost its reputation as the comeback kings of the SANFL when a Ty Allen goal in the 32nd minute of the final term gave them a six-point lead.

But South responded through Daniel a minute later, allowing it to escape with a draw after blowing a 33-point third-quarter lead.

The result means Glenelg will hang on to fifth spot regardless of whether Port defeats Sturt at AAMI Stadium today.

But the Tigers' poor form in the first half against South and tough matches against Norwood and Central District in the next fortnight suggest they might not be there much longer.

South showcased both sides of its game in the first half - blasting clear with attacking play in the opening term before shutting down the Tigers with strong defensive work in the second.

The Panthers held their opponents goalless in the second quarter while kicking three of their own to take a 32-point half-time lead.

Not even a careless error by Shaun McKernan, whose set shot from 10m out was touched by the man on the mark, could hold back Fuller's side.

Blessed at the Crows selection table this week when Andy Otten, Myke Cook and McKernan were all made available, South coach Ron Fuller also had the luxury of bringing in Daniel Talia to shore up his defence.

The quartet made an undoubted difference to South's structure and with Glenelg ruckman Trevor Cranston missing with a side strain, McKernan dominated the ruck.

A goal to Michael Wundke 10 minutes into the third term extended South's advantage to a match-high 33 points but Glenelg responded with



Early misses in the fourth to Mark Ruwoldt and Jordan McMahon offered South a reprieve but Glenelg

four consecutive goals to breathe life wouldn't be denied and soon took the lead as Ruory Kirkby took control.

Kirkby almost won Glenelg the match, kicking four goals in the final quarter including a belter from the boundary line.

But South kept fighting and was given a helping hand by Todd Grima who was superb in defence but was reported in the final term for a late hit on Andrew Horne.
