# New coach but same old Bays

THE Kris Massie era began with a whimper at Prospect Oval yesterday as a Johnny Boras-inspired North Adelaide handed Glenelg a 29-point defeat.

Five days after sacking coach Mark Mickan and replacing him with former Crow Massie, the Tigers stretched their winless streak to five matches and finally lost their place in the top five.

North well and truly kept its season alive with the polished victory, in which it tackled hard, used the ball well and only missed three of its 24 shots at goal.

James Allan had at least 10 disposals in every quarter on his way to 45 for the match and with Cohen Thiele and James Bennett chipping in, North had the upper hand in the midfield throughout.

And in 20-year-old man mountain Boras, North fans have another imposing full forward in the tradition of Grenville Dietrich and Daniel Hargraves to get excited about. Boras kicked eight goals straight, handed off three others and seemed to inspire dropped Power forward Daniel Motlop who kicked 4.0 of his own.

"He's a bit of an enigma," North coach Josh Francou said of Boras. "The thing I like about him - other than his ability to lead and kick goals - is he gives us a real physical presence."

With Boras, Motlop and Nick Gill all firing in attack, Francou had the luxury of playing skipper Clint Alleway in defence – where he took several contested marks and controlled the game.

But it was former Tiger Brett Backwell who set the tone with an exceptional first quarter.

In his first game against his old club, Backwell helped set up two early goals, kicked one himself and then sent Mark Ruwoldt hobbling to the changerooms with an AC joint injury after a pair of big bumps.

By that time North had a 17-point lead as Glenelg continued its run of ordinary first quarters this season.

Chad Cornes sparked to life in the second term with four marks and two goals and Cameron Hitchcock continued to try and lift the Tigers.

But after a patch of ordinary play the Roosters lifted their skills back to the level of the opening term and kicked out to a 39-point half-time lead. The Roosters gave up a fourgoal lead in a seven-point loss at the Bay earlier this season and when Glenelg kicked the first 2.2 of the third quarter a similar comeback looked on yesterday.

But George Thring nailed a set shot to spark a run of five North goals in seven minutes – including two each to Boras and Motlop – as the Roosters ran amok.

Conceding six goals to three in the final term was a minor blight on arguably North's best performance under Francou.

The Roosters are just two games out of the top five with a game against Sturt that they will be favoured to win coming up next.

Glenelg, which followed its 93-point loss to Central District with another panicked, directionless display, has a chance to recover against a slumping West Adelaide at the Bay.

"To be honest I expected... a little more fire and a little more passion," Massie said.


