# Dogs revel in winter footy

CENTRAL District left the Bay yesterday with much more than just two premiership points following a 43-point win over Glenelg.

The victory, built on a blistering nine-goal second quarter, revealed plenty of positive signs for the second half of the year.

Justin Hardy tore the game apart with six first-half goals in his most explosive performance for the club. Twenty-year-old Jack Hannath proved he can lead a ruck division and key midfielders Scott Dutschke. Brayden O'Hara and Chad O'Sullivan showed they're slowly recapturing their best form. And veteran James Gowans still has plenty to give as evidenced with his 19 hardfought disposals.

Glenelg was far from disgraced and matched Central District's hardness at the footy. But a costly lapse in intensity in the second quarter meant they were playing catch-up for the rest of the game.

"We were a bit undisciplined early ... but then we saw a

better side of us in the second quarter," Bulldogs coach Roy Laird said.

"We scored well. It was probably the best we've moved and attacked with some scoreboard pressure."

It was hard to fault the Tigers' endeavour led by Andrew Bradley, Jason Davenport and Ty Allen around the footy.

They got on top early and controlled possession, but as soon as the Dogs steadied with their forward 50 entries, the home side was vulnerable.

Three quick goals to Hardy put the visitors in front early in the second term before Glenelg responded.

But Hardy's dominance continued and Dutschke, Williams, Boyd and O'Hara got busy in the middle and put the Dogs 34 points up at half-time.

Central kept the pressure on in the third term and although two late goals to Kirkby gave the Tigers half a chance, a comeback never seemed likely.

Tigers coach Kris Massie said his side's contested ball and attitude was positive. "The will and want to com-

pete was there, but a number of areas let us down," Massie said.

"We had 53 less effective kicks so their ability to keep ball on body and execute was better than ours. (And) five of their goals in the second term were based on our turnovers."

Hardy did his damage in the first half when he out-bodied Riley Milne, but was kept relatively quiet after half-time when Sam Rudolph was moved on to him.

"He's strong yet he's mobile for a big bloke. If he can do that more often, our players will have confidence to go there quick," Laird said.

Massie said he did not think he was slow to react to Hardy's dominance because he wanted to trust his defenders and it presented a learning opportunity for Milne.

But he conceded the Tigers lacked a big-bodied defender.

"Rudolph and Milne have a similar build," Massie said.

"Are we lacking a big, key strong defender? Sam Shaw covered that early in the year (and) it's exposing us now as a club."

The Tigers are also likely to be without forward Cameron Hitchcock for at least a week after he suffered a hamstring injury in the first term.


