GLENELG'S finals hopes hang in the balance following a eight-point loss to Norwood in the penultimate minor round at Brighton Rd last night.

The fifth-placed Tigers are just a game above Woodville-West Torrens with Port Adelaide a game further back and still alive in the race for the a top five spot.

The Eagles can climb level with the Tigers with a win over Sturt tomorrow.

The Redlegs, who have the bye next week, claimed their 18th win and will finish the minor round at least eight points clear of their nearest rival.
