GLENELG'S AFL-led midfield ruined South Adelaide's Good Friday footy party with a 29-point win to open the season at Noarlunga last night.

Jarryd Lyons, Tom Lynch and Tom Logan ran amok while key forward Ruory Kirkby tore the game open with a three-goal burst in 10 minutes in the third term.

But Glenelg's best player was 21-year-old Craig Pitt who, in just his 17th game, dominated across half-back, winning his one-on-one contests and thrusting the Tigers forward.

Coach Kris Massie described Pitt as "a real barometer" for the group and said when he was playing well, his team-mates grew in confidence around him.

Massie said having his AFL players available allowed him the luxury to play Pitt, Andrew Bradley and Hayden Jolly in defence, and Ty Allen and Andrew Hooper forward.

"It gives us more licence to have quality at either end of the ground," Massie said. "The main thing I spoke about was the ability of the group to come together because we've got a few recruits, a fair slice of AFL players and a mix of young and experienced players."

Panthers coach Ron Fuller said Glenelg won all areas of the ground.



South's Good Friday push pays off

THE SANFL will consider expanding its Good Friday commitments after South Adelaide's massive success in hosting games for the past two years.

The Panthers attracted 4530 fans to its Noarlunga home for the clash with Glenelg on Friday - an increase of 300 on last year when the club successfully pushed the SANFL for football on the first day of the Easter long weekend.

SANFL state league manager Chris Davies said other clubs had shown an interest in Good Friday action and that would be considered for next season.

The league was thrilled with the response to the opening round, with 18,417 fans attending the four games.

There were 7560 spectators at The Parade on Thursday night for the battle between reigning premier Norwood and arch rival Port Adelaide.

The highly-encouraging support for the state league's first round comes in the wake of a summer filled with negative news, including salary cap issues and huge financial concerns for Sturt and West Adelaide.

"It has been a fantastic start to the SANFL season," Davies said.

"The crowd figures show

clearly that the appetite for SANFL footy is there.

"South Adelaide has made Good Friday football its own and the club has done a tremendous job in making it a real event for supporters.

"They continue to want to expand on what they are doing.

"We have had other clubs show interest in Good Friday football and we will have to think about that in 2014."

The SANFL is expecting healthy crowds again this weekend with Sturt hosting Port Adelaide at The Parade on Friday night and Glenelg, a first round winner, taking on Norwood at home on Saturday night.
