GLENELG snapped a ninegame losing streak against Central District with a 10-point victory in a lacklustre encounter at Brighton Road last night.

The Tigers were forced to overcome a patchy performance to come from behind and secure their second win for the

Incredibly, the Bulldogs have lost their opening four games and are at the bottom of the premiership ladder as the only club without a win.

The tone for the game was established early with the two sides coughing up a flood of clumsy turnovers.

Missed targets, dropped marks or handballs and poor decision making hurt both teams and few players were able to produce the composure required for this level. Bulldogs defender Trent Goodrem was an exception

Too many players overplayed situations with an extra unnecessaary handball, allowing opponents to pounce and defuse threatening forays.

Late in the opening term Lewis Hender gave away an undisciplined free kick when he pushed James Boyd in the back after the Bulldogs rover had kicked the ball deep into attack.

Justin Hardy nailed the goal after the siren to enable the visitors to grab a nine-point advantage at quarter-time.

When Ben Mules kicked the Tigers' second goal for the fourth quarter without a reply from the visitors the Bulldogs had had their lead cut to just two points.
