Classy Tigers conquer Blues

GLENELG claimed its third victory of the season and received a dose of confidence with a 28-point win over Sturt at Glenelg Oval last night.

The Tigers, seriously challenged by the Double Blues, showed character and fighting spirit to overpower the visitors in an entertaining contest.

Despite being without several key weapons, the Tigers showed superior composure and class for longer periods to claim the vital premiership points.

The Tigers, opening with the strong wind in their faces, started the contest as they finished last week's victory over Central District - in control with confident run and carry as well as skilful delivery deep into attack.

Tigers bigman Shaun McKernan, an option to replace injured Taylor Walker in the Crows line-up, needed to impress and he was hot early with two goals in the opening three minutes.

Just nine minutes into the match, the home side had exploded to a 20-point lead on the back of positive ball movement and a willingness to work hard to become an option linking from defence to attack.

But it was not just when in possession that the Tigers were impressive. Their pressure on the Double Blues was relentless and they ensured there were numbers at the contest.

Their efforts rushed Sturt into a swag of mistakes and the Double Blues, reluctant to match their opponent's workrate, also coughed up plenty of undisciplined acts.

It took Sturt 12 minutes with the wind to register their first score, a goal to James Wundke, and amazingly, the visitors trailed by only 13 points at quarter-time. Given the number of passengers in the Double Blues line-up, a few should have joined the fans when the ground announcer asked the spectators

to leave the playing surface nearing the end of the quarter-time break.

Whatever Sturt coach Seamus Maloney said to his players at the break had an impact because their attitude and work ethic lifted.

Former Tiger Matthew Duldig got on the end of some fine work from team-mates to nail the first two goals of the second quarter.

The Tigers had 31 more possessions and dominated the tackle count in the first term but the trend altered in the second quarter when Sturt got its hands to far more ball at the stoppages.

The Double Blues hit the front 20 minutes into the second quarter when Duldig kicked his fourth goal.

Unlike its fluency of the first quarter, Glenelg overplayed its hand too often and the Double Blues forced turnovers.

The third quarter became a replica of the first with the Tigers regaining the ascendancy, winning the hard ball and rediscovering the authority it showed early.

It was familiar names sparking Glenelg attacking raids with Jarryd Lyons, Tom Logan and Ryan McInerney getting their hands to plenty of possessions. Two late goals to Lachlan Button enabled the Tigers to burst to a 31-point advantage and have the game at their mercy.
