WOW, even the most faithful Glenelg fans would not have seen that coming.

The Tigers, with just one win for the season and a recent history littered with frustration and heartache, knocking over mighty Norwood by nine points at the Bay yesterday. Nope, did not see that coming.

It has been a satisfying week for Tigers coach Matthew Lokan, celebrating his re-appointment for next season with the amazing upset. Just what the win meant to Lokan was evident immediately after the final siren when he raced onto the ground to congratulate his players.

"Footy is an emotional sport and I don't hide it, I'm passionate about football," Lokan said.

"We knew we could push them but we knew it would take a pretty good effort which we were able to deliver.

"This is a resilient group and easy to coach. My role is to motivate the players but they do a pretty good job as well. We are realistic where we are at but we know where we can go with consistent footy."

Inconsistency has been the enemy for the Tigers this sea-

son. So there was a sort of expectation the Redlegs would eat away at the Tigers' 38-point lead late in the second quarter. Surely the Tigers would lapse as had been the case most of the year?

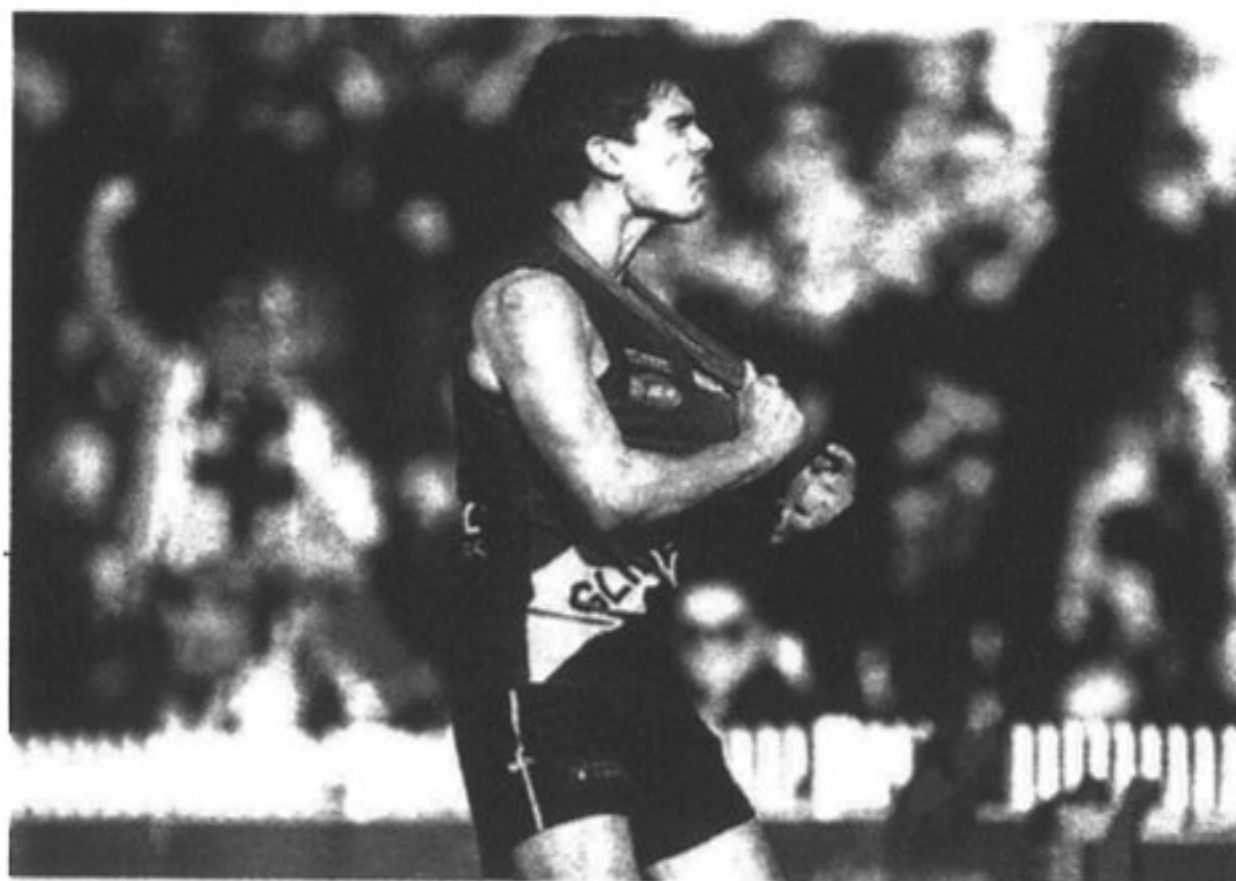
The Redlegs rally did come, cutting deep into a 32-point deficit four minutes into the final term. But a Redlegs win would have been a total injustice, it would have been robbery.

These two premiership points belonged to the Tigers, who finally gave Lokan the honest four-quarter effort he has been seeking. They dominated the possession count, tackled with intent, moved the ball with conviction and stung the Redlegs with their relentless pressure.

Matthew Snook was busy on the ball, Aaron Joseph was the general in defence and up forward Clint Alleway and Jake Johansen gave the visitors plenty of headaches.

The Redlegs lost Josh Donohue and Mat Suckling in the first quarter and ruckman Sam Baulderstone was limping for much of the second half.

"They made us defend and we did not respond - they picked us apart," Redlegs coach Ben Warren said.
