Match draw in blackout

THE battle between Glenelg and Adelaide at the Bay was last night declared a draw after a power failure halted play in the final quarter.

The ground dramatically went into darkness just a minute after the Crows had evened the scores at 51-all, having retrieved a 20-point deficit at three-quarter time.

After half-time the scores are declared final if the game has to be called off and the Tigers will rue conceding a goal to Nick Mott within a minute of the blackout.

It is the first premiership point for both sides after they had been winless coming into the round four contest.

The Tigers had the wind at their backs for the opening term and key forward Clint Alleway, who missed last week's loss to Central District because of suspension, showed his value to the side after just five minutes when he nailed the first goal.

Scrappy football was a constant as players struggled to master the testing weather conditions.

The Tigers were sloppy with their movement going into attack and the Crows defence - where youngster Jake Lever was having an intriguing battle with Alleway - was able to regularly mop up.

There was a sprinkling of highlights. Midway through the first quarter a promising Crows

movement found Anthony Wilson 50m from goal and he used his pace to burst clear of attempted tackles and kick truly for the side's second.

Late in the term, Tiger Darcy Bailey got the ball deep in the pocket and dribbled the ball through for a goal to give the home side an light-point lead.

Experienced pair Sam Lonergan and Aaron Joseph got their hands to plenty of inside ball for the Tigers while Mitch Grigg, Brodie Martin, Matt Crouch and Luke Carey were busy for the Crows. Crouch's hands in traffic to release team-mates was skilful.

The Crows were dealt a setback in the first quarter when Sam Kerridge limped from the ground with an injury to his left leg. Continual downpours made life difficult in the second quarter and despite being camped in attack, the Crows could not capitalise.

It was an ugly term of action with plenty of stoppages often resembling rugby union's rolling maul. There were eight behinds registered for the second quarter - five to the Crows - as goals were hard to come by.

The Tigers doubled their half-time advantage when Willie Rioli kicked a valuable goal in the opening minute of the third quarter. When Lonergan nailed a set shot 16 minutes into the term the lead had grown to 19 points and the Crows were under the pump to respond.
