NORWOOD opened up a four-goal lead in the opening 15 minutes and then kept Glenelg at arm's length all night at The Parade last night to reclaim top spot, at least temporarily.

The Redlegs' midfield and forward line looked set to have a field day when they seemingly effortlessly opened up the Tigers early in the match but to Glenelg's credit it steadied and kept the Redlegs honest for much of the match.

But for all its gallantry Glenelg remains winless five matches into the season and playing four quarters of football remains an issue.

Matt Panos was yet again the star for Norwood with a powerful 24-possession three-goal game to send yet another message to AFL scouts.

Mitch Wilkins is also fitting in well after rejoining the Redlegs from North Melbourne and Brady Dawe continues to influence games.

Redlegs coach Ben Warren would also be pleased with the functionality of his forward line - where Michael Newton (5.5) was the star - even though it was wasteful.

The Redlegs are now 4-1 and on top of the table but South Adelaide can replace them with a win over the Crows today.

Ex-Bomber Sam Lonergan was superb for the Bays last night, his effort and tackling indicative of Glenelg after its sloppy opening.

Clint Alleway (four goals) also contributed for the Tigers and Terry Milera (three goals) has added class.

It was a mild, dry night at Norwood and there were signs early of a blowout to match last year's 21-goal hammering the Bays copped at The Parade might be on the cards.
