

Rioli lights way for Bays

A RIOLI - one of Australian football's most famous names - lit up Alberton Oval yesterday as Glenelg produced an inspired 19-point win over Port Adelaide.

William Rioli kicked five goals in the Tigers' third and arguably best win of the season which saw them leap past the Magpies on the ladder.

But the game took a hefty injury toll on both sides with Glenelg losing captain Andrew Bradley and Rhys O'Keefe and Port Adelaide losing Robbie Young and Alipate Carlile, who went down in the first quarter and was, on crutches after the game.

It was a gritty performance by the Tigers who started strongly then surrendered all control by conceding seven unanswered goals in the second quarter.

But they clawed back in the third and when the game was on the line in the last quarter they had the answers with Rioli combining with Terry Milera to create havoc in the forward line.

"We haven't won here for five years and we put a big focus on that," Glenelg coach Matt Lokan said.

"We started great ... obviously had a disappointing second quarter and then credit to our guys that we turned it around in the second half and got back on top with our contested ball.

"They're (wins) all good, especially where we're coming from, but to be able to come back from the second quarter and run over a good side is a rewarding win."

Port Adelaide coach Chad Cornes said despite the seven-goal-to-one second quarter he didn't ever feel like his side was in the contest.

"I just thought it was a really flat performance in the first quarter with no real energy and excitement around the group which is surprising after a week off, how we played two weeks ago and what the game meant," Cornes said.

puzzled with after the game, wondering why we didn't come out ready to play.

"Even in that (second) quarter sitting in the coaches' box I wasn't sensing that energy that when we play with it's really good footy to watch."

Glenelg denied the Magpies the ball with 33 more disposals and 10 more marks in the first quarter. But it was a completely different Port Adelaide side to emerge after the break as it kicked the next seven goals of the game to storm into the lead. It was Brendon Ah Chee who got it moving in the middle and Zachary Hawkins, Luke Reynolds and Jesse Palmer booted two goals each to capitalise when it went forward.

On the end of Riley Bonner's thumping kick-ins the Magpies kicked two early goals to start the third quarter but the Tigers rallied thanks to Ben Sawford's clearance work in the middle.

Milera stepped up in the third quarter with three goals including a contender for goal of the year when he spilt the mark but recovered and swung around without looking to soccer it through from 20m on a tight angle.

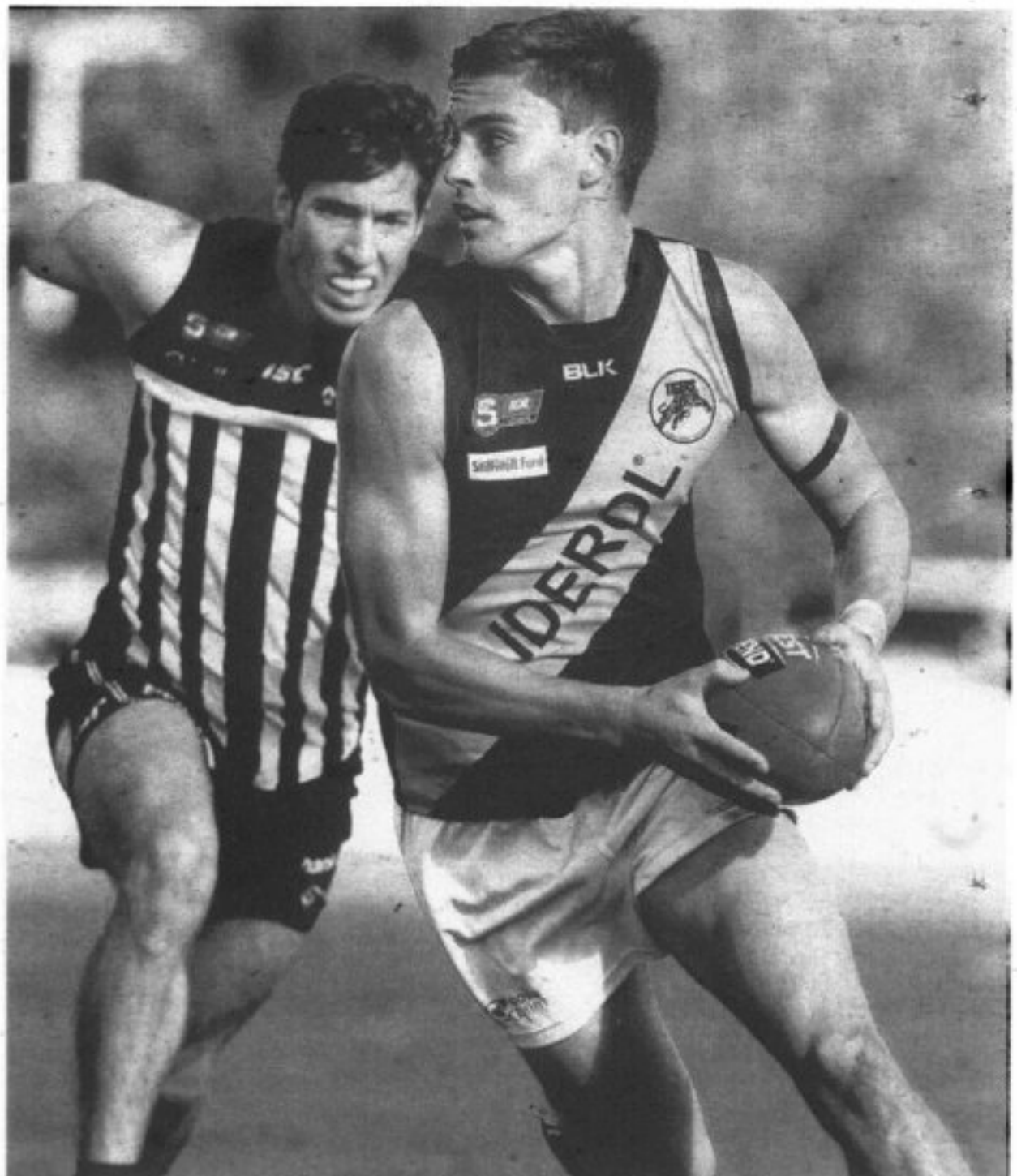
