# Tigers' spirit rewarded

GLENELG could have been forgiven for turning up the toes when it trailed South Adelaide by 28 points early in the final quarter at the Bay yesterday.

The Tigers had dropped their previous three contests in lacklustre fashion to be all but out of the race for a spot in the finals.

The Panthers are third on the ladder and headed for the major round.

For much of the first half of the season, the Tigers played with tremendous passion with little reward on the premiership table.

Yesterday, that spirited fight returned and the reward was a 10-point triumph.

The Tigers, fuelled by enthusiasm and a hunger for the ball, smashed the Panthers around the stoppages after half-time.

They restricted the Panthers to just a solitary goal in the second half — a Joel Cross major four minutes into the third term — and to a single behind in the final quarter.

"That is what we base our game around, the effort around the contest," Glenelg coach Matthew Lokan said after the victory.

"Our intensity around the contest was really good at times, it was average early in the game.

"It is a credit to the boys for bouncing back.

"In the past we perhaps shied away from that contest once we got behind. Internally we think we are doing a lot right.

"It's probably more a consistency thing. Did we do it for four quarters today? No. But we did it for long enough to get a really good win."

The Panthers, led by Brede Seccull and Matthew Rose, took control of the contest midway through the second quarter, securing plenty of ball to put the Tigers defence under the pump.

However, they wasted scoring chances and too often coughed up possession with over use of the handball or sloppy decision-making.

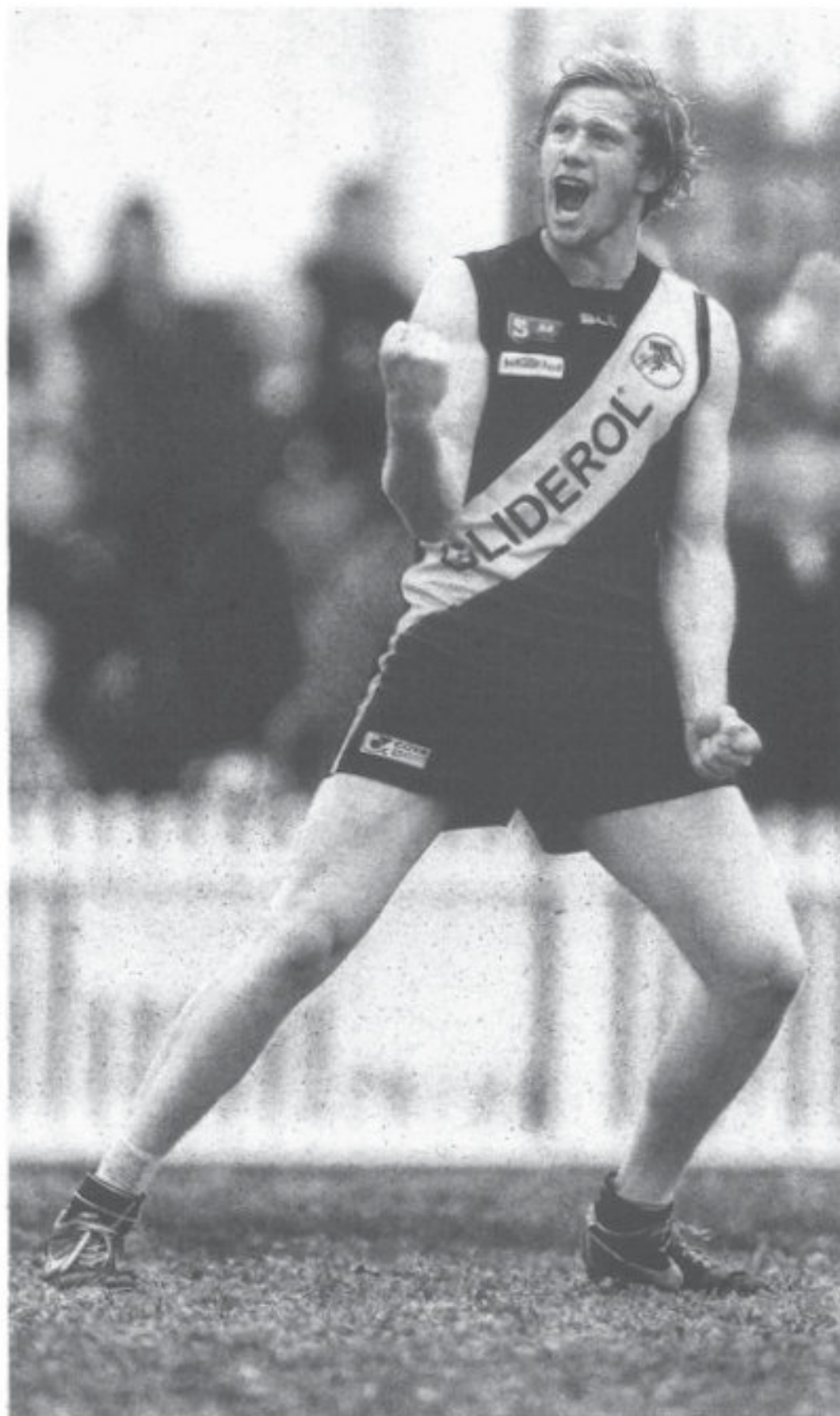
As the third quarter lengthened, the Tigers' confidence grew.
