GLENELG coach Matthew Lokan was measured in his comments and keeping the lid tightly shut on expectations at the Bay.

There was a definite positive vibe in the Tigers' change-rooms after the six-point triumph over Norwood at home yesterday. But Lokan was content to go with the "taking it a week at a time" line.

However, a few of the players will surely take a sneaky look at the premiership ladder showing the Tigers are just a game behind fifth-placed Central District. Their remaining games are against the Bulldogs in Elizabeth, Port Adelaide at home and Woodville-West Torrens and Sturt away.

"We don't think about the finals. It is a cliché but it is a week at a time for us," Lokan said. "Where our group is at and the way we sort of started the season, we need to keep winning."

"Although it was not pretty, we got the job done. I don't

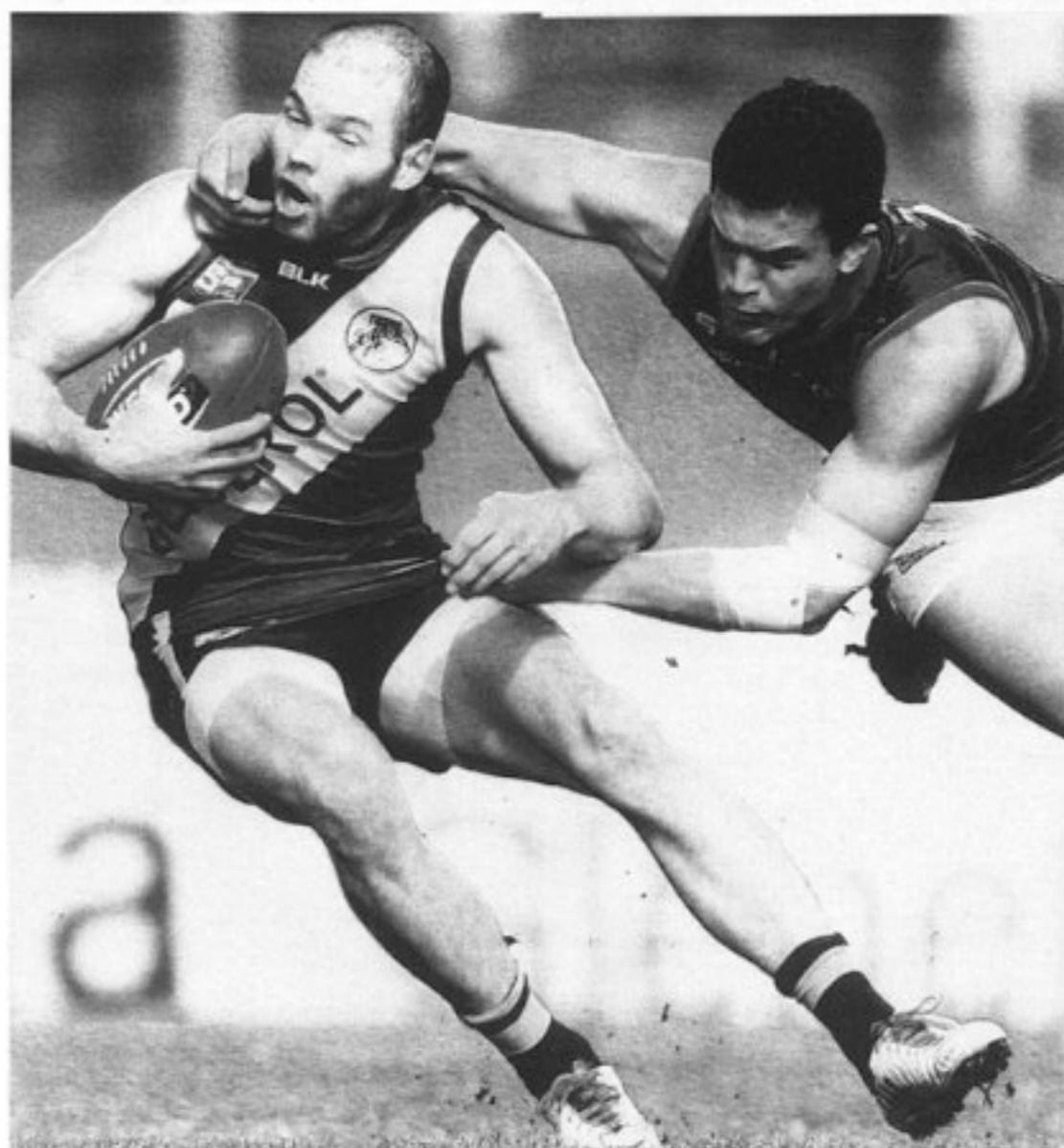
think it will go down in the highlights reel as one of our better wins but it is always a fierce rivalry between Glenelg and Norwood and to get over the line is pleasing."

It's a shame the contest was decided by a holding-the-ball penalty against Norwood. Tiger Willie Rioli was the recipient, nailing the goal as the siren sounded.

As Lokan noted, it was not a pretty match. But it was hard-fought in conditions made difficult by the strong wind and both sides had plenty of combatants only too willing to get their hands dirty. The Redlegs, who had first use of the strong wind, led by 25 points at three-quarter time and they tried to hang on grimly against a composed Tigers outfit.

"It was a scrappy game and I thought we had the ascendancy most of the day, other than when it mattered," Redlegs coach Ben Warren said.

"Credit to Glenelg, they outworked us in the last quarter. We'd spent a fair few tickets early ... we worked hard most of the day."
