NORWOOD coach Jarrod Cotton questioned the attitude of his players after the upset loss to West Adelaide last week.

His issue was whether the side had "turned up ready to play".

Well, the Redlegs heeded his message and were definitely ready for action when they conquered Glenelg by 41 points at the Bay last night.

Kristen Rooke nailed the opening goal five minutes into the game and when teammates Sam Baulderstone and Matthew Panos added goals for the Redlegs within the next two minutes, the visitors were in control.

The situation was even more precarious for the Tigers when Baulderstone sunk a bomb from wide out to increase the advantage to 24 points after just nine minutes.

The Redlegs were hungry for the contest and they produced terrific ball movement to have the home side well-and-truly on the back foot.
