## South survives Tigers' charge

The Panthers won all 10 home games last year.


It was the Tigers' first loss for the season after conquering Port Adelaide and reigning premier Sturt at the Bay in the opening two rounds.

The Tigers' tackling pressure was impressive early and they retrieved plenty of turnover ball to create terrific movement, only to fail to capitalise on their chances.
