THIS is one of those games Glenelg can be relieved it got the two premierships points and quickly focus on next week.

The Tigers produced one quarter of decent football, nailing five goals in the final term, to escape with a four-point victory against winless West Adelaide at the Bay yesterday.

For three quarters they resembled nothing of the side which had climbed into the top five on the back of constructive actions, especially at home where they have claimed all four wins.

The Bloods just don't know how to win. Again they were a spirited, desperate mob, only to drop their seventh game for the season.
