# Tigers' pressure proves decisive

A SECOND-HALF hammering led Glenelg to a vital win over Adelaide yesterday to breathe life back into its season.

It was an arm wrestle in the opening two quarters at Glenelg Oval before the Tigers came out snarling after the main break and kicked 11 goals to six on their way to a 17.8 (110) to 11.11 (77) victory.

Glenelg moved to 3-4 with the victory and put itself in touching distance of the top five after a lacklustre start to its first season under coach Mark Stone. The Bays were hungrier all day, smashed Adelaide in the contest and won the tackle count with an impressive 109 to 82.

"Their talls got us early, they were on top with their bigs which was causing us a few headaches," Stone said.

"Once we were able to bring it to ground and started bouncing it out of their attacking 50 it evened up a bit.

"I thought our tackling pressure just wore them down in the end, especially in that middle part of the game where it was really on the line."

The Crows led by six points at quarter time but were wasteful in the second term, kicking five behinds.

Adelaide was able to remain in the contest until late goals to Terry and Ian Milera gave the Bays a slender eight-point lead at half-time. The Tigers were poor by hand and foot in the third term but Adelaide was unable to take advantage.

Hard-nosed midfielders Nick Amato (24 disposals) and Matthew Snook (23) led the way and were ferocious in the contest with 13 and 12 tackles respectively.

Jesse White was stretched off with a neck brace after he was concussed midway through the second term.

Patrick Wilson continued to bang on the door for AFL selection and was comfortably the Crows' best on his way to 29 disposals and a goal.
