Westies put up fight but no match as Tigers' unbeaten run rolls on

IT will be a long forgotten win if Glenelg converts its now 17-0 reign into a premiership as the Bays did enough to put away a competitive West Adelaide by 36 points.

On a chilly Friday night at Richmond Oval, the Bloods got off to a bright start by winning the toss and keeping the peerless Tigers to just two majors in the opening stanza.

However, the home team was unable to isolate any of its forwards inside the arc against a water-tight Bays back six.

Mobile Bloods forward Hamish Ellem was industrious (four marks) but did most of his work further up the ground.

But for the undefeated Glenelg it was a different tale at the business end, able to pick out marking options but just without the customary polish as Lachie Hosie fluffed two gettable chances.

Glenelg set up much of its forward thrusts with razor-sharp use of handball (50 for the quarter), as an opening 14-minute goalless period was ended by a brilliant Darcy Bailey soccer.

That was quickly followed by some Brad

Agnew opportunism; clearing from a centre bounce only to produce a crumbing goal in the goal square moments later.

Then in the second, further slick handball released Dylan Landt for a couple of damaging runs through the middle for majors — slotting one himself while finding Luke Reynolds for another.

While lacking the Tigers' class, the home team hung in for their faithful braving the cold, leading the tackle count (38-32). And with Josh Ryan keeping Liam McBean to a solitary point for the half, a rare Glenelg defensive turnover created Connor Fairlie's first.

A stunning low and laser-like Mitch Maguire pass to a marking and goaling Harry Lemmey was the high-point of a half lacking genuine highlights.

It was matched by a brilliant checkside from the boundary from captain Tom Keough to open the third. But two Hosie majors snuffed out any remote thought of the Bloods getting within striking distance.

The game opened up in an 11-goal final term but the result was never in doubt.

The Coach's Match Report - Glenelg v West Adelaide

Heading to Richmond on a Friday night was quite weird after another bye, and with this being only our second night game of the season and with the Power playing the Cats I wasn't sure what sort of crowd would attend. But I was quite pleased with the number of loyal SANFL Glenelg fans that turned up in the cold conditions to watch us play.

It had been 16 rounds since we last played West after and very disappointing performance by them a few weeks ago we knew they would be quite competitive. Losing Luke Partington meant we could make a few changes and have a look at a few things heading into the finals but we were keen to make our mark on the game early. Unfortunately we didn't reward ourselves with scoreboard pressure but I felt like we had

control of the game and the ball.

The second quarter saw Lachie Hosie kick his first goal since round 7 against the Panthers but once again we weren't able to capitalise on our midfield dominance and inside 50 entries. However, we still managed to kick four goals to take a 27-point lead into half time. 50. However for the last 15 minutes we didn't execute some of the fundamentals of the game, which hurt us on transition, and West were able to capitalise on a few mistakes.

Brett Turner was the standout mid for the game, collecting 35 disposals and 7 clearances along with 12 tackles. Andrew Bradley and Dylan Landt were quite important with their ball use and Matt Snook had his usual industrious game. It was good to see Darcy

Bailey rewarded for his hard work with three goals, well Agnew, as Reynolds, Hosie kicking two goals.

We now go into our last minor round game against a very strong Port Magpies team with about 16 listed players, which will give us a great test leading into finals.
